## **HOUSE BILL NO. 5372**

October 06, 2021, Introduced by Reps. O'Neal and Rendon and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1931 PA 328, entitled "The Michigan penal code,"

by amending section 224f (MCL 750.224f), as amended by 2014 PA 4.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 224f. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), a person
- 2 convicted of a felony shall not possess, use, transport, sell,
- 3 purchase, carry, ship, receive, or distribute a firearm in this
- 4 state until the expiration of 3 years after all of the following
- 5 circumstances exist:

- (a) The person has paid all fines imposed for the violation. 1
- 2 (b) The person has served all terms of imprisonment imposed for the violation. 3
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- (c) The person has successfully completed all conditions of 5 probation or parole imposed for the violation.
- 6 (2) A person convicted of a specified felony shall not
- 7 possess, use, transport, sell, purchase, carry, ship, receive, or
- distribute a firearm in this state until all of the following 8
- 9 circumstances exist:
- 10 (a) The expiration of 5 years after all of the following 11 circumstances exist:
- 12 (i) The person has paid all fines imposed for the violation.
- 13 (ii) The person has served all terms of imprisonment imposed 14 for the violation.
- 15 (iii) The person has successfully completed all conditions of 16 probation or parole imposed for the violation.
- 17 (b) The person's right to possess, use, transport, sell, 18 purchase, carry, ship, receive, or distribute a firearm has been
- 19 restored under section 4 of 1927 PA 372, MCL 28.424.
- 20 (3) Except as provided in subsection (4), a person convicted
- of a felony shall not possess, use, transport, sell, carry, ship, 21
- 22 or distribute ammunition in this state until the expiration of 3
- 23 years after all of the following circumstances exist:
- 24 (a) The person has paid all fines imposed for the violation.
- 25 (b) The person has served all terms of imprisonment imposed for the violation. 26
- (c) The person has successfully completed all conditions of 27 28 probation or parole imposed for the violation.
- 29 (4) A person convicted of a specified felony shall not

- 1 possess, use, transport, sell, carry, ship, or distribute
- 2 ammunition in this state until all of the following circumstances
- 3 exist:
- 4 (a) The expiration of 5 years after all of the following
- 5 circumstances exist:
- (i) The person has paid all fines imposed for the violation.
- 7 (ii) The person has served all terms of imprisonment imposed 8 for the violation.
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- 9 (iii) The person has successfully completed all conditions of probation or parole imposed for the violation.
- 11 (b) The person's right to possess, use, transport, sell,
- 12 purchase, carry, ship, receive, or distribute ammunition has been
- 13 restored under section 4 of 1927 PA 372, MCL 28.424.
- 14 (5) A person convicted of a misdemeanor involving domestic
- 15 violence shall not possess, use, transport, sell, purchase, carry,
- 16 ship, receive, or distribute a firearm or ammunition in this state
- 17 until the expiration of 8 years after all of the following
- 18 circumstances exist:
- 19 (a) The person has paid all fines imposed for the violation.
- 20 (b) The person has served all terms of imprisonment imposed
- 21 for the violation.
- 22 (c) The person has successfully completed all conditions of
- 23 probation imposed for the violation.
- 24 (6) (5) A person who possesses, uses, transports, sells,
- 25 purchases, carries, ships, receives, or distributes a firearm in
- 26 violation of this section is guilty of a felony punishable by
- 27 imprisonment for not more than 5 years or a fine of not more than
- 28 \$5,000.00, or both.
- 29 (7) (6)—A person who possesses, uses, transports, sells,

- carries, ships, or distributes ammunition in violation of thissection is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not
- 3 more than 5 years or a fine of not more than \$5,000.00, or both.
- 4 (8) (7) Any single criminal transaction where a person
  5 possesses, uses, transports, sells, carries, ships, or distributes
  6 ammunition in violation of this section, regardless of the amount
  7 of ammunition involved, constitutes 1 offense.
- 8 (9) (8) This section does not apply to a conviction that has
  9 been expunged or set aside, or for which the person has been
  10 pardoned, unless the expunction, order, or pardon expressly
  11 provides that the person shall not possess a firearm or ammunition.
- 12 (10)  $\frac{(9)}{}$  As used in this section:

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- (a) "Ammunition" means any projectile that, in its currentstate, may be expelled from a firearm by an explosive.
- (b) "Felony" means a violation of a law of this state, or of another state, or of the United States that is punishable by imprisonment for 4 years or more, or an attempt to violate such a law.
  - (c) "Misdemeanor involving domestic violence" means a violation of the laws of this state or another state, a political subdivision of this state or another state, or the United States that is punishable by imprisonment for not more than 1 year, and in which any of the following occur:
- (i) The victim is the convicted person's spouse or former 25 spouse.
- 26 (ii) The victim has or has had a dating relationship, as that 27 term is defined in section 81, with the convicted person.
- 28 (iii) The victim has or has had a child in common with the 29 convicted person.

- 1 (*iv*) The victim is a resident or former resident of the 2 convicted person's household.
- 3 (d) (10) As used in subsections (2) and (4), "specified
  4 "Specified felony" means a felony in which 1 or more of the
  5 following circumstances exist:
- 6 (i) (a) An element of that felony is the use, attempted use, or 7 threatened use of physical force against the person or property of 8 another, or that by its nature, involves a substantial risk that 9 physical force against the person or property of another may be 10 used in the course of committing the offense.
- (ii) (b) An element of that felony is the unlawful manufacture,
   possession, importation, exportation, distribution, or dispensing
   of a controlled substance.
- 14 (iii) (c) An element of that felony is the unlawful possession 15 or distribution of a firearm.
- 16 (iv)  $\frac{d}{d}$  An element of that felony is the unlawful use of an explosive.
- 18 ( $\nu$ ) (e)—The felony is burglary of an occupied dwelling, or 19 breaking and entering an occupied dwelling, or arson.
