A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 5456 (MCL 333.5456), as amended by 2002 PA 644.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 5456. (1) "Department" means the department of community
 2 health.
- (1) (2) "Deteriorated paint" means paint or other surface
 coating that is cracking, flaking, chipping, peeling, or otherwise
 damaged or separating from the substrate of a building component.

- 1 (2) (3)—"Discipline" means 1 of the specific types or
 2 categories of lead-based paint activities identified in this part
 3 for which an individual may receive training from an accredited
 4 training program and become certified by the department.
- (3) (4)—"Distinct painting history" means the application
 history, as indicated by its visual appearance or a record of
 application, over time of paint or other surface coatings to a
 component or room.
- 9 (4) (5)—"Documented methodology" means a method or protocol
 10 used to do either or both of the following:
 - (a) Sample and test for the presence of lead in paint, dust, and soil.
- (b) Perform related work practices as described in rulespromulgated under this part.

- (5) (6)—"Dust lead hazard" means surface dust in a residential dwelling or child occupied facility that contains a concentration of lead at or in excess of levels identified by the EPA pursuant to section 403 of title IV of the toxic substances control act, Public Law 94-469, 15 U.S.C.—USC 2683, or as otherwise defined by rule.
- (7) "Elevated blood level" or "EBL" means for purposes of lead abatement an excessive absorption of lead that is a confirmed concentration of lead in whole blood of 20 ug/dl, micrograms of lead per deciliter of whole blood, for a single venous test or of 15-19 ug/dl in 2 consecutive tests taken 3 to 4 months apart. For purposes of case management of children 6 years of age or less, elevated blood level means an excessive absorption of lead that is a confirmed concentration of lead in whole blood of 10 ug/dl.
- (8) "Encapsulant" means a substance that forms a barrier
 between lead-based paint and the environment using a liquid-applied

coating, with or without reinforcement materials, or an adhesively 1 2 bonded covering material. (9) "Encapsulation" means the application of an encapsulant. 3 (10) "Enclosure" means the use of rigid, durable construction 4 materials that are mechanically fastened to the substrate in order 5 6 to act as a barrier between lead-based paint and the environment. 7 (11) "EPA" means the United States environmental protection 8 agency. 9 Enacting section 1.
