A bill to amend 1939 PA 280, entitled $\mbox{"The social welfare act,"}$

by amending section 10f (MCL 400.10f), as added by 2013 PA 41.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 10f. (1) The department shall perform an incarceration
- 2 match monthly to obtain information to assist in determining
- 3 eligibility based on incarceration status.
- 4 (2) If the department determines that a recipient is
- 5 incarcerated at the time the incarceration match is performed, the
- 6 department shall not issue a bridge card to that incarcerated

- 1 recipient. If a bridge card has already been issued to the
- 2 incarcerated recipient, the department shall terminate that
- 3 recipient's cancel the bridge card access.and recover the remaining
- 4 balance.
- 5 (3) The department shall must perform a monthly match using
- 6 the United States social security Social Security death index
- 7 database to determine if a recipient is deceased. If the department
- 8 determines that a recipient is deceased at the time the United
- 9 States social security Social Security death index match is
- 10 performed, the department shall not issue a bridge card to that
- 11 deceased recipient. If a bridge card has already been issued to the
- 12 deceased recipient, the department shall terminate that recipient's
- 13 bridge card access.
- 14 (4) On at least a monthly basis, the department shall receive
- 15 and review information from the state registrar, including, but not
- 16 limited to, death records, concerning individuals enrolled in
- 17 public assistance that indicates a change in circumstances that may
- 18 affect eligibility.
- 19 (5) The department shall enter into a data matching agreement
- 20 with the bureau of state lottery, Michigan gaming control board,
- 21 and any other relevant state board or agency to, on at least a
- 22 monthly basis, identify households with lottery or gambling
- 23 winnings of \$3,000.00 or more. To the extent permissible under
- 24 federal law, the department shall treat this data as verified upon
- 25 receipt. To the extent the data may not be verified upon receipt,
- 26 the department shall make referrals for further investigation to
- 27 identify households with winnings equal to or greater than the
- 28 resource limit for elderly or disabled households as defined in 7
- 29 CFR 273.8(b). Individuals or households that have failed to

- 1 disclose a winning and are identified through the database match
- 2 have presumptively committed an intentional program violation.
- 3 (6) On at least a quarterly basis, the department shall
- 4 receive and review information from the unemployment insurance
- 5 agency concerning individuals enrolled in public assistance that
- 6 indicates a change in circumstances that may affect eligibility,
- 7 including but not limited to changes in employment or wages. The
- 8 unemployment agency shall provide information required under this
- 9 subsection to the department each quarter in compliance with
- 10 section 11 of the Michigan employment security act, 1936 (Ex Sess)
- 11 PA 1, MCL 421.11.
- 12 (7) On at least a monthly basis, the department must review
- 13 information concerning individuals enrolled in public assistance
- 14 that indicates a change in circumstances that may affect
- 15 eligibility, including but not limited to potential changes in
- 16 residency as identified by out-of-state electronic benefit transfer
- 17 transactions.
- 18 (8) On at least a quarterly basis, the department must make
- 19 available to the public on its website, data from findings of
- 20 noncompliance and fraud investigations in public assistance for the
- 21 following aggregate and nonconfidential and information that does
- 22 not personally identify a recipient:
- 23 (a) The number of public assistance cases investigated for
- 24 intentional program violations or fraud.
- 25 (b) The total number of public assistance cases referred to
- 26 the attorney general's office for prosecution.
- 27 (c) Improper payments and expenditures.
- 28 (d) Money recovered.
- (e) Aggregate data concerning improper payments and ineligible

- 1 recipients as a percentage of those investigated and reviewed.
- 2 (f) The aggregate amount of funds expended by electronic
- 3 benefit transfer card transactions in each state outside of this
- 4 state.
- 5 (9) If the department receives information concerning an
- 6 individual enrolled in public assistance that indicates a change in
- 7 circumstances that may affect eligibility, the department shall
- 8 review the individual's case.
