HOUSE BILL NO. 6010

April 13, 2022, Introduced by Rep. Slagh and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1980 PA 299, entitled "Occupational code,"

by amending section 1201 (MCL 339.1201), as amended by 2020 PA 20.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1201. As used in this article:
- 2 (a) "Apprentice" means an individual who is engaged in
- 3 learning cosmetology in a cosmetology establishment.
- 4 (b) "Braiding" means providing or offering to the general
- 5 public for compensation any of the following services solely for

- 1 development or improvement of physical qualities of the natural
- 2 hair structure:
- $\mathbf{3}$ (i) Intertwining in a systematic motion to create patterns in a
- 4 3-dimensional form.
- (ii) Inversion or outversion flat against the scalp along the
- 6 part of a straight or curved row.
- 7 (iii) Twisting in a systematic motion.
- 8 (iv) Extension with natural or synthetic fibers.
- 9 (c) "Cosmetologist" means an individual who performs or offers
- 10 to perform 1 or more cosmetology services.
- 11 (d) "Cosmetology" means performing 1 or more cosmetology
- 12 services.
- 13 (e) "Cosmetology establishment" means a place of business at
- 14 which 1 or more cosmetology services are offered or provided.
- 15 Cosmetology establishment includes a mobile salon and a cosmetology
- 16 suite. Cosmetology establishment does not include a school of
- 17 cosmetology.
- 18 (f) "Cosmetology services" means any of the following:
- 19 (i) Hair care services.
- 20 (ii) Skin care services.
- 21 (iii) Manicuring services.
- (iv) Electrology.
- 23 (g) "Cosmetology suite" means a room or suite located inside a
- 24 licensed cosmetology establishment that is leased or rented from
- 25 the owner of the cosmetology establishment for the purposes of
- 26 offering or providing 1 or more cosmetology services.
- 27 (h) "Electrologist" means an individual who performs or offers
- 28 to perform electrology.
- (i) "Electrology" means the permanent removal of hair from the

- 1 body of an individual by the use of electricity.
- 2 (j) "Esthetician" means an individual who performs or offers3 to perform skin care services.
- 4 (k) "Hair care services" means arranging, cutting, dressing,
- 5 curling, waving, cleansing, singeing, bleaching, coloring, tinting,
- 6 trimming, styling, relaxing, perming, straightening, or similar
- 7 work upon the hair of the head or a wig that an individual is
- 8 wearing.
- $oldsymbol{9}$ (1) "Instructor" means an individual who teaches or offers to
- 10 teach 1 or more cosmetology services in a school of cosmetology.
- 11 (m) "Manicuring services" means the cleansing, filing,
- 12 shaping, buffing, polishing, or beautifying of the nails of the
- 13 hands or feet, and the cleansing, massaging, stimulating,
- 14 exercising, or beautifying of the skin of the hands, arms, and
- 15 feet, manually or with the use of tools, appliances, or cosmetic
- 16 preparations, including the repair of nails, or the creation or
- 17 decoration of artificial nails. Manicuring services do not include
- 18 the practice of podiatric medicine and podiatric surgery as defined
- 19 in section 18001 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- 20 333.18001.
- 21 (n) "Manicurist" means an individual who performs or offers to
- 22 perform manicuring services.
- 23 (o) "Mobile salon" means either of the following:
- 24 (i) A self-contained vehicle or other device that is moved,
- 25 towed, or transported from 1 location to another and in which
- 26 equipment used to perform 1 or more cosmetology services is
- 27 installed.
- 28 (ii) A business in which equipment used to perform 1 or more
- 29 cosmetology services is transported to and used on a temporary

- 1 basis at a location other than the premises of the owner,
- 2 including, but not limited to, any of the following:
- 3 (A) A cosmetology establishment owned by another person.
- 4 (B) A client's home.
- 5 (p) "Natural hair cultivation" means techniques that result in
- 6 tension on hair strands such as twisting, wrapping, weaving,
- 7 extending, locking, or braiding of the hair by hand. , if that work
- 8 Natural hair cultivation includes shampoo services. Natural hair
- 9 cultivation does not include the application of dyes, reactive
- 10 chemicals, or other preparations to alter the color or to
- 11 straighten, curl, or alter the structure of the hair. As used in
- 12 this subsection, "shampoo services" means preparing a customer for
- 13 a shampoo, or shampooing or blow-drying a customer.
- 14 (q) "Natural hair culturist" means an individual who is
- 15 engaged in natural hair cultivation but does not include an
- 16 individual who is engaged in natural hair cultivation if that
- 17 activity is performed as part of the practice of a recognized
- 18 religion.
- 19 (r) "Owner" means a person who owns and conducts a cosmetology
- 20 establishment or a school of cosmetology.
- 21 (s) For a mobile salon, "premises" means 1 of the following,
- 22 as applicable:
- 23 (i) For a mobile salon described in subdivision (o) (i), the
- 24 vehicle or other device and the equipment installed in the vehicle
- 25 or device.
- 26 (ii) For a mobile salon described in subdivision (o) (ii), the
- 27 equipment used to perform the cosmetology services, and the
- 28 temporary location at which the equipment is used, while the
- 29 equipment is at that location.

- (t) "School of cosmetology" means a school that teaches 1 or
 more cosmetology services at a premises designated in the license
 application.
- 4 (u) "Skin care services" includes the following services or 5 combination of services:
- 6 (i) Beautifying the skin of the body of an individual by the
 7 use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, or
 8 creams, including body wrapping.
- 9 (ii) Cleansing or stimulating the skin of the body by the use 10 of the hands, devices, apparatus, or appliances, with or without 11 the use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, or creams.
- (iii) The temporary removal of hair from the body of an
 individual by the use of depilatories, waxes, razors, scissors,
 clippers, or tweezers.
- (iv) Giving facials, applying removable makeup, applying
 eyelashes, or any other application of a preparation or beauty
 enhancement to the body of an individual but does not include
 applying permanent makeup or the use of tanning equipment.
- (v) "Student" means an individual who is engaged in learning
 cosmetology or 1 or more cosmetology services in a school of
 cosmetology.
