

HOUSE BILL NO. 6051

April 26, 2022, Introduced by Reps. Beson and Paquette and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 1947 PA 336, entitled

"An act to prohibit strikes by certain public employees; to provide review from disciplinary action with respect thereto; to provide for the mediation of grievances and the holding of elections; to declare and protect the rights and privileges of public employees; to require certain provisions in collective bargaining agreements; to prescribe means of enforcement and penalties for the violation of the provisions of this act; and to make appropriations,"

(MCL 423.201 to 423.217) by adding section 15c.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 15c. (1) Subject to subsection (2), a public school

1 employer shall audiorecord each meeting it conducts with a
2 bargaining representative of its public employees that is related
3 to the negotiation of a collective bargaining agreement and, not
4 later than 2 business days following the meeting, shall make the
5 full, unedited audiorecording of the meeting available to the
6 public on its website homepage.

7 (2) This section does not limit any law requiring a greater
8 degree of openness for a meeting between a public school employer
9 and a bargaining representative of its public employees and does
10 not prohibit a public school employer from adopting a policy that
11 provides for a greater degree of openness for a meeting between it
12 and a bargaining representative of its public employees.

13 (3) This section does not apply to a unit of local government
14 unless the legislature, if needed to comply with section 29 of
15 article IX of the state constitution of 1963, appropriates
16 sufficient funding to the unit of local government for any new or
17 increased costs that would be incurred by the unit of local
18 government in the implementation of this section.

19 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
20 unless Senate Bill No.____ or House Bill No. 6048 (request no.
21 05644'22) of the 101st Legislature is enacted into law.
