## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 9. (1) The department, in discharging its
- 2 responsibilities under this act, shall provide, directly or through
- 3 the purchase of services from other agencies and professions,
- 4 multidisciplinary services such as those of a pediatrician,
- 5 psychologist, psychiatrist, public health nurse, social worker, or

- 1 attorney through the establishment of regionally based or
- 2 strategically located teams. The department shall prepare a
- 3 biennial report to the legislature containing information on the
- 4 activities of the teams created pursuant according to this
- 5 subsection and including recommendations by the teams and the
- 6 department regarding child abuse and or child neglect when
- 7 committed by persons a person responsible for the child's health or
- 8 welfare.
- 9 (2) The department shall assure ensure a continuing education
- 10 program for department, probate court, and private agency
- 11 personnel. The program shall include responsibilities, obligations,
- 12 and powers under this act and the diagnosis and treatment of child
- 13 abuse and or child neglect when committed by persons a person
- 14 responsible for the child's health or welfare.
- 15 (3) The department shall provide for the dissemination of
- 16 information to the general public with respect to the problem of
- 17 child abuse and child neglect in this state and the facilities,
- 18 prevention, and treatment methods available to combat child abuse
- 19 and or child neglect when committed by persons a person responsible
