A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

by amending sections 252, 254, 267, and 269 (MCL 168.252, 168.254, 168.267, and 168.269), section 254 as amended by 2021 PA 146 and section 269 as amended by 2014 PA 94.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 252. (1) No person An individual shall not be eligible to
- 2 the office of county road commissioner who shall not have been
- 3 unless the individual is a citizen of the United States and a
- 4 qualified and registered elector of the county in which election is

- 2 election. The shall he be a member of the county board of
- 3 supervisors. In addition, an individual shall not be eligible for

- 5 the county board of commissioners.

- 11 to obtain the printing of the name of an individual as a candidate
- 12 for nomination by a political party for the office of county road
- 13 commissioner under a particular party heading upon the official
- 14 primary ballots, there must be filed with the county clerk of the
- 15 county nominating petitions signed by a number of qualified and
- 16 registered electors residing within the county as determined under
- 17 section 544f. In a county with single-member districts for the
- 18 office of county road commissioner, to obtain the printing of the
- 19 name of an individual as a candidate for nomination by a political
- 20 party for the office of county road commissioner under a particular
- 21 party heading upon the official primary ballots, there must be

- 4 nominating petitions, a nonrefundable filing fee of \$100.00 to be
- 5 paid to the county clerk. Payment of the fee and certification of
- 6 the name of the candidate paying the fee are governed by the same
- 7 provisions as in the case of nominating petitions. The fee must be
- 8 deposited in the general fund of the county and must be used only
- 9 for the purchase and maintenance of voting equipment.
- Sec. 267. The office of county road commissioner in any county
- 11 in this state shall must become vacant upon the happening of any of

- 27 (i) His or her refusal or neglect to give bond in the amount

- 1 commissioner, a qualified person shall individual must be appointed
- 2 to fill the vacancy by the county board of commissioners. If a
- 3 vacancy occurs in a single-member county road commission district,
- 4 a qualified individual from that single-member district must be
- 5 appointed to fill the vacancy by the county board of commissioners.
- 6 The person-individual appointed shall take the oath of office, give
- 7 bond in the manner required by law, and hold office for the
- 8 remainder of the unexpired term and until a successor is elected
- 9 and qualified. However, in a county in which county road
- 10 commissioners are elected, if the vacancy occurs more than 7 days
- 11 before the nominating petition filing deadline as provided in
- 12 section 254 for the general November election that is not the
- 13 general November election at which a successor in office would be
- 14 elected if there were no vacancy, the person individual appointed
- 15 shall hold office only until a successor is elected at the next
- 16 general November election in the manner provided by law and
- 17 qualifies for office. The successor shall hold the office for the
- 18 remainder of the unexpired term.
- 19 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 20 unless Senate Bill No. or House Bill No. 6094 (request no.
- 21 05508'22) of the 101st Legislature is enacted into law.
