HOUSE BILL NO. 6556

December 07, 2022, Introduced by Rep. Rabhi and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Outdoor Recreation.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending sections 41301, 41302, and 41303 (MCL 324.41301, 324.41302, and 324.41303), as amended by 2018 PA 451.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 41301. (1) As used in this part:
- 2 (a) "Amphibian" means any frog, toad, or salamander of the
- 3 class Amphibia.

- (b) "Aquatic", except as used in subdivision (q), (r),
 describes an amphibian, crustacean, fish, mollusk, reptile,
 wiggler, or aquatic plant.
- 4 (c) "Aquatic plant" means a submergent, emergent, obligate
 5 wetland, facultative wetland, or floating-leaf plant or a fragment
 6 thereof, including a seed or other propagule. Aquatic plant does
 7 not include wild rice (Zizania aquatica or Zizania palustris).
- 8 (d) "Crustacean" means freshwater crayfish, shrimp, or prawn9 of the order Decapoda.
 - (e) "Genetically engineered" refers to an organism whose genome, chromosomal or extrachromosomal, is modified permanently and heritably, using recombinant nucleic acid techniques, or the progeny of such an organism.
- 14 (f) "Introduce", with reference to an organism, means to
 15 knowingly and willfully stock, place, plant, release, or allow the
 16 release of the organism in this state at any specific location
 17 where the organism is not already naturalized.
 - (g) "MISIN" means the Midwest Invasive Species Information
 Network, a regional effort to provide early detection and rapid
 response to invasive species that is led by researchers in Michigan
 State University's department of entomology along with partners
 from the Midwest region, or a successor organization.
- (h) (g) "Mollusk" means any mollusk of the classes Bivalviaand Gastropoda.
- (i) (h) "Native" means indigenous to any location in thisstate.
- 27 (j) (i)—"Nonaquatic" describes a bird, insect other than a
 28 wiggler, or mammal.
- (k) $\frac{(j)}{(j)}$ "Nonnative" means not native.

- 27 (viii) Any of the following prohibited mollusk species,
- 28 including a hybrid or genetically engineered variant of the species
- 29 or an egg of the species or of a hybrid or genetically engineered

- 3 (B) Carthusian snail (Monacha cartusiana).

- 7 (F) Wrinkled dune snail (Candidula intersecta).
- 8 (m) (l) "Recombinant nucleic acid techniques" means laboratory
- 9 techniques through which genetic material is isolated and

- 11 (n) (m) "Relevant commission", "relevant department", or
- "relevant director" means the following:

- 17 of the species or of a hybrid or genetically engineered variant:
- 18 (A) Quagga mussel (Dreissena bugensis).
- 19 (B) Zebra mussel (Dreissena polymorpha).
- 20 (q) (p) "Watercraft" means any conveyance used or designed for
- 21 navigation on water, including, but not limited to, any vessel,
- 22 ship, boat, motor vessel, steam vessel, vessel operated by
- 23 machinery, motorboat, sailboat, barge, scow, tugboat, and rowboat.
- (r) $\frac{(q)}{(q)}$ "Wiggler" means an aquatic egg, nymph, or larva of an
- 25 insect.
- 26 (2) For the purposes of this part:
- 27 (a) A person is not considered to possess a live organism
- 28 simply because the organism is present on land or in waters owned
- 29 by that person unless the person has knowingly introduced that live

- 1 organism on that land or in those waters.
- 2 (b) A person is not considered to possess a live organism if
- 3 the organism was obtained from the environment and the person only
- 4 possesses the organism at the specific location at which it was
- 5 obtained from the environment.
- 6 (c) A person is not considered to possess a live organism if
- 7 the possession is for the purpose of promptly destroying the
- 8 organism.
- 9 Sec. 41302. (1) The relevant commission may by order add to or
- 10 delete a species from the list of prohibited species or restricted
- 11 species under section 41301. Before the natural resources
- 12 commission issues an order under this subsection, it shall consult
- 13 with the department of agriculture and rural development. Before
- 14 the commission of agriculture and rural development issues an order
- 15 under this subsection, it shall consult with the department of
- 16 natural resources. After the consultation, and at least 30 days
- 17 before the relevant commission issues the order, the relevant
- 18 department shall post a copy of the proposed order on the relevant
- 19 department's website and shall submit a copy of the proposed order
- 20 to all of the following:
- 21 (a) The legislature.
- 22 (b) The standing committees of the senate and house of
- 23 representatives with primary responsibility for any of the

- 25 (i) Agricultural issues.

- 18 (iii) Based on a risk assessment, any of the following apply:
- (A) The organism has the potential to harm human health or to
 harm natural, agricultural, or silvicultural resources.
- (B) Effective management or control techniques for theorganism are not available.
- (3) The relevant commission shall list an aquatic species as a
 prohibited species or restricted species if the relevant commission
 determines the following based on after considering a review by the
- 26 relevant department:
- (i) The organism is not native or is genetically engineered.

- (ii) The organism is not naturalized in this state or, if 1 2 naturalized, is not widely distributed.
- 3 (iii) Based on a risk assessment, any of the following apply:
- (A) The organism has the potential to harm human health or to 4 severely harm natural, agricultural, or silvicultural resources. 5
- 6 (B) Effective management or control techniques for the 7 organism are not available.
- 8 (b) For an aquatic restricted species, all of the following 9 requirements are met:
- 10 (i) The organism is not native.

- 11 (ii) The organism is naturalized in this state.
- 12 (iii) Based on a risk assessment, any of the following apply:
- (A) The organism has the potential to harm human health or to13 harm natural, agricultural, or silvicultural resources. 14
- (B) Effective management or control techniques for the 16 organism are not available.
- 17 (4) The department of natural resources or the department of 18 agriculture and rural development shall review for listing under 19 this section each species that is listed by MISIN as an invasive 20 species, that has not previously been reviewed for listing under 21 this section, and for which that department is the relevant 22 department. For those species listed by MISIN as of the effective 23 date of the amendatory act that added this subsection, the relevant department shall perform 1/4 of its required reviews by June 1,

- 25 2024, and an additional 1/4 by June 1 of each of the 3 subsequent
- 26 years. For each species initially listed by MISIN after the
- 27 effective date of the amendatory act that added this subsection,
- 28 the relevant department shall review the species within 90 days
- 29 after it is listed by MISIN. Not later than 60 days after the

- (a) The relevant department shall review each aquatic animal listed or delisted as injurious wildlife under the Lacey act, 16 USC 3371 to 3378 and 18 USC 42, and each aquatic plant designated or removed from designation as a noxious weed under the plant protection act, title IV of Public Law 106-224, for listing or delisting as a prohibited species or restricted species within 180 days after the change in federal listing or designation.
- 14 (b) The relevant department shall review each aquatic species
 15 that has the potential to harm human health or natural,
 16 agricultural, or silvicultural resources for listing as a
 17 prohibited species or restricted species even if the species is not
 18 currently on either federal list described in subdivision (a).
- (c) The relevant department may review other aquatic speciesfor listing as prohibited or restricted species.
- (6) (5)—The relevant director may issue an emergency order designating an organism as a prohibited species or restricted species if the organism has the potential to harm human health or to severely harm natural, agriculture, or silvicultural resources. An emergency order is effective for 90 days or a shorter period if specified in the order. The relevant department shall do all of the following:
- (a) Post a proposed emergency order on its website andotherwise publicize the proposed emergency order in a manner that

- ensures that interested persons are provided notice of the proposed
 emergency order, the reasons for the emergency order, and the
 proposed effective date of the order.
- 4 (b) Provide a copy of the proposed emergency order to each
 5 member of the standing committees of the senate and the house of
 6 representatives that consider legislation pertaining to
 7 conservation, the environment, recreation, tourism, or natural
 8 resources.
- 9 (c) Post the final emergency order on its website.

- 10 (7) (6) The relevant department may issue an order setting 11 forth the conditions under which naturalized organisms of an 12 aquatic restricted species may be harvested, possessed, and 13 transported.
- Sec. 41303. (1) A person shall not knowingly possess a live organism if the organism is a prohibited species or restricted species, except under 1 or more of the following circumstances:
 - (a) The person intends to present a specimen of the prohibited species or restricted species, for identification or similar purposes, to a person who is a certified applicator or registered applicator under part 83, to a public or private institution of higher education, or to the department of natural resources, the department of agriculture and rural development, or any other state, local, or federal agency with responsibility for the environment, natural resources, or agriculture.
 - (b) The person has been presented with a specimen of a prohibited species or restricted species for identification or similar purposes under subdivision (a).
- (c) The person possesses the prohibited species or restrictedspecies in conjunction with otherwise lawful activity to eradicate

1 or control the prohibited species or restricted species.

2 (d) The possession is pursuant to a permit issued for
3 education or research purposes by the relevant department under
4 section 41306 or, if the prohibited species or restricted species
5 is a plant species or an insect other than a wiggler, by the United
6 States Department of Agriculture.

- 7 (e) The species is an aquatic restricted species and the 8 person possesses the species in compliance with an order under 9 section 41302(6).41302(7).
- 10 (2) A person described in subsection (1)(b) or (c) shall
 11 notify the department of natural resources, the department of
 12 agriculture and rural development, or the department of
 13 environmental quality if the prohibited species or restricted
 14 species was found at a location where it was not previously known
 15 to be present.
