## **SENATE BILL NO. 1**

January 13, 2021, Introduced by Senator THEIS and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 2253 (MCL 333.2253), as amended by 2006 PA 157, and by adding section 2253a.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2253. (1) If Subject to section 2253a, if the director
- 2 determines that control of an epidemic is necessary to protect the
- 3 public health, the director by emergency order may prohibit the
- 4 gathering of people persons for any purpose and may establish

- 1 procedures to be followed during the epidemic to insure ensure
- 2 continuation of essential public health services and enforcement of
- 3 health laws. Emergency procedures shall—are not be—limited to this
- 4 code.
- 5 (2) If an epidemic described in subsection (1) involves avian
- 6 influenza or another virus or disease that is or may be spread by
- 7 contact with animals, the department of agriculture and rural
- 8 development shall cooperate with and assist the director in the
- 9 director's response to the epidemic.
- 10 (3) Upon On request from the director, the department of
- 11 agriculture and rural development shall assist the department in
- 12 any review or update of the department's pandemic influenza plan
- 13 under section 5112.
- Sec. 2253a. Beginning November 15, 2020, an emergency order
- 15 issued under section 2253 is valid for the time period specified in
- 16 the order or until the order has been in effect for 28 days,
- 17 whichever is sooner. After 28 days, an emergency order issued under
- 18 section 2253 is not valid unless a request from the director to
- 19 extend the order for a specific number of days is approved by
- 20 resolution of both houses of the legislature.
- 21 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act is intended to be
- 22 retroactive and applies to emergency orders issued under section
- 23 2253 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.2253, on or
- **24** after November 15, 2020.
