## **SENATE BILL NO. 97**

February 03, 2021, Introduced by Senators ANANICH, BULLOCK, SANTANA, MCCANN, HERTEL, WOJNO, POLEHANKI, BRINKS, CHANG, GEISS, BAYER and HOLLIER and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 1984 PA 431, entitled "The management and budget act,"

(MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594) by adding section 270.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 270. (1) The board shall create, develop, staff, and
- 2 operate the MI supply infrastructure facility in this state to
- 3 design, manufacture, assemble, warehouse, and distribute personal
- 4 protection equipment, ventilators, flood remediation supplies, and
- 5 other emergency equipment.
- 6 (2) The MI supply board is created within the department. The

- 1 board shall consist of the following members, appointed by the
- 2 governor as follows:
- 3 (a) The state fire marshal.
- 4 (b) The director of department of health and human services.
- 5 (c) A professor of supply chain management at a university or
- 6 college located in this state.
- 7 (d) A professor of economics at a university or college
- 8 located in this state.
- 9 (e) A professor or instructor at a community college located
- 10 in this state with experience in job training or workforce
- 11 development.
- 12 (f) Four members as follows:
- 13 (i) One individual from a list of 2 or more individuals
- 14 nominated by the senate majority leader.
- 15 (ii) One individual from a list of 2 or more individuals
- 16 nominated by the senate minority leader.
- 17 (iii) One individual from a list of 2 or more individuals
- 18 nominated by the speaker of the house of representatives.
- 19 (iv) One individual from a list of 2 or more individuals
- 20 nominated by the minority leader of the house of representatives.
- 21 (3) The members first appointed to the board shall be
- 22 appointed within 30 days after the effective date of the amendatory
- 23 act that added this section. Members of the board shall serve for
- 24 terms of 4 years or until a successor is appointed, whichever is
- 25 later. If a vacancy occurs on the board, the governor shall make an
- 26 appointment for the unexpired term in the same manner as the
- 27 original appointment. The governor may remove a member of the board
- 28 for incompetence, dereliction of duty, malfeasance, misfeasance, or
- 29 nonfeasance in office, or any other good cause.

- 1 (4) The first meeting of the board shall be called by the
- 2 governor. At the first meeting, the board shall elect from among
- 3 its members a chairperson and other officers as it considers
- 4 necessary or appropriate. After the first meeting, the board shall
- 5 meet at least quarterly, or more frequently at the call of the
- 6 chairperson. A majority of the members of the board constitute a
- 7 quorum for the transaction of business at a meeting of the board. A
- 8 majority of the voting members present and serving are required for
- 9 official action of the board. The business that the board may
- 10 perform shall be conducted at a public meeting of the board held in
- 11 compliance with the open meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to
- 12 15.275. A writing prepared, owned, used, in the possession of, or
- 13 retained by the board in the performance of an official function is
- 14 subject to the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231
- 15 to 15.246. Members of the board shall serve without compensation.
- 16 However, members of the board may be reimbursed for their actual
- 17 and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their
- 18 official duties as members of the board.
- 19 (5) The board shall work to ensure that the citizens of this
- 20 state have adequate emergency supplies. The board shall work with
- 21 the state director of emergency management to determine
- 22 manufacturing schedules of emergency supplies.
- 23 (6) The board has authority to do all the following:
- 24 (a) Hire employees, managers, specialists, consultants, and
- 25 experts to operate the MI supply infrastructure facility in this
- 26 state.
- 27 (b) Purchase raw materials and other goods and services that
- 28 are necessary to produce emergency supplies.
- 29 (c) Distribute or sell emergency supplies in this state or

- 1 outside this state.
- 2 (d) Charge nominal fees for emergency supplies sold or
- 3 distributed to governmental entities located in this state and
- 4 charge market rates for emergency supplies sold or distributed to
- 5 all other entities.
- 6 (e) Develop programs and partnerships tailored to skilled
- 7 trades and industrial job training workforce development.
- 8 (f) Perform any other acts required to carry out the purposes
- 9 described in this section.
- 10 (7) The board may purchase or lease property and construct and
- 11 develop facilities to operate the MI supply infrastructure
- 12 facility.
- 13 (8) The board shall ensure that all emergency supplies
- 14 manufactured or distributed by the MI supply infrastructure
- 15 facility meet all Federal Drug Administration regulations for those
- 16 emergency supplies.
- 17 (9) At the end of each fiscal year, all unallocated profits
- 18 earned from the MI supply infrastructure facility shall be
- 19 deposited in the general fund.
- 20 (10) Not later than January 1 of each year, the board shall
- 21 report to the legislature on the activities of the MI supply
- 22 infrastructure facility. The report shall include all the following
- 23 and shall be published on the department's website:
- 24 (a) The amount and type of emergency supplies manufactured or
- 25 distributed by the MI supply infrastructure facility.
- 26 (b) Rationale for the amount of each emergency supply
- 27 manufactured or distributed.
- 28 (11) The board shall seek and secure funding from other
- 29 governmental entities and nongovernmental entities to operate the

- 1 MI supply infrastructure facility.
- 2 (12) This section shall be known as the MI supply act.
- 3 (13) As used in this section:
- 4 (a) "Emergency supplies" means personal protection equipment
- 5 and other emergency supplies, and ventilators, flood remediation
- 6 supplies, fire protection and emergency equipment, road hazard
- 7 mediation or remediation supplies, as determined by the board.
- 8 (b) "MI supply board" or "board" means the MI supply board
- 9 created in this section.
- 10 (c) "Other emergency equipment" includes, but is not limited
- 11 to, gloves, gowns, laboratory coats, face shields or masks, eye
- 12 protection, mouthpieces, resuscitation bags, pocket masks, or
- 13 ventilation devices.
- 14 (d) "Personal protection equipment" means protective equipment
- 15 for the hands, feet, eyes, ears, faces, or anything on a person, as
- 16 well as respiratory systems.
