SENATE BILL NO. 448

May 18, 2021, Introduced by Senator THEIS and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 1979 PA 94, entitled
"The state school aid act of 1979,"

(MCL 388.1601 to 388.1896) by adding section 34a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 34a. (1) From the federal funding appropriated in section
- 2 11, there is allocated \$55,000,000.00 from the federal funding
- 3 awarded to this state from the elementary and secondary emergency
- 4 relief (ESSER) fund under section 2001(f)(1) of the American rescue
- 5 plan act of 2021, title II, subtitle A, part 1 of Public Law 117-2,
- 6 to Grand Valley State University for, subject to subsection (8),

- 1 the purposes described in subsections (2) and (3) to address
- 2 learning loss among students, including, but not limited to, low-
- 3 income students, children with disabilities, English learners,
- 4 migrant students, students experiencing homelessness, and children
- 5 in foster care, by providing information and assistance to parents
- 6 and families to effectively support students, including in a
- 7 distance learning environment.
- 8 (2) Subject to subsection (8), Grand Valley State University
- 9 shall use the funding it receives under subsection (1) toward the
- 10 establishment of a grant program as provided under this subsection.
- 11 By not later than August 1, 2021, Grand Valley State University
- 12 shall establish a grant program for reading scholarships to
- 13 eligible children.
- 14 (3) Grand Valley State University shall directly apply funding
- 15 it receives under subsection (1) for each eligible child as a
- 16 reading scholarship described in subsection (2) toward the payment
- 17 of eligible services selected by the eligible child's parent or
- 18 legal guardian in the application described in subsection (6).
- 19 Grand Valley State University may apply funding under subsection
- 20 (1) only toward eligible services, as provided under this
- 21 subsection, for eligible children who are enrolled in districts
- 22 that have depleted the funding they designated for purposes of
- 23 subsection (4) under section 11r(4). Grand Valley State University
- 24 may apply, from the funding under subsection (1), only an amount
- 25 not to exceed \$1,000.00 for each eligible child.
- 26 (4) A district, in consultation with Grand Valley State
- 27 University, shall determine the number of eligible children
- 28 enrolled in the district. From the funding a district designated
- 29 for the purposes of this subsection under section 11r(4), the

- 1 district shall directly apply funding for each eligible child
- 2 described in this subsection as a reading scholarship described in
- 3 subsection (2) toward the payment of eligible services selected by
- 4 the eligible child's parent or legal guardian in the application
- 5 described in subsection (6). A district may apply, from the funding
- 6 described in this subsection, only an amount not to exceed
- 7 \$1,000.00 for each eligible child.
- 8 (5) Grand Valley State University shall develop a catalog of
- 9 eligible services and shall provide this catalog to the parent or
- 10 legal guardian of each eligible child. The catalog developed under
- 11 this subsection must be provided to all districts and must be
- 12 available to the general public through Grand Valley State
- 13 University's website homepage. The catalog described in this
- 14 subsection must include only services that provide any of the
- 15 following that are designed to improve reading or literacy:
- 16 (a) Instructional materials or curricula.
- 17 (b) Part-time tutoring services.
- 18 (c) Specialized summer education programming.
- (d) After-school education programming.
- 20 (6) Grand Valley State University shall establish an
- 21 application process for applicants to apply for reading
- 22 scholarships through the grant program described in subsection (2).
- 23 The application process must provide for both of the following:
- 24 (a) The verification of the identity of the eligible child's
- 25 parent or legal guardian.
- 26 (b) Require the parent or legal quardian of the eligible child
- 27 who is seeking the reading scholarship to select, from the catalog
- 28 developed under subsection (5), which services the parent or legal
- 29 guardian would like his or her child to participate in through the

- 1 reading scholarship.
- 2 (7) A child to whom all of the following apply is an eligible
- 3 child under this section:
- 4 (a) The child is enrolled in kindergarten or any of grades 1,
- 5 2, 3, 4, or 5 in a district.
- 6 (b) The child is less than proficient in reading, based on
- 7 available assessment data, including benchmark assessment data and
- 8 state summative assessment data.
- 9 (c) The child has applied for a reading scholarship through
- 10 the grant program described in subsection (2) through the
- 11 application process described in subsection (6).
- 12 (8) From the funding allocated under subsection (1), an amount
- 13 not to exceed \$1,000,000.00 may be utilized by Grand Valley State
- 14 University for administrative costs associated with the
- 15 administration of the grant program described in subsection (2).
- 16 Grand Valley State University may charge a fee not exceeding 3% of
- 17 the total administrative costs associated with the administration
- 18 of the grant program described in subsection (2) for each
- 19 application submitted through the process described in subsection
- 20 (6).
- 21 (9) Each district shall notify the parent and legal guardian
- 22 of each eligible child enrolled in the district that his or her
- 23 child meets the criteria of an eligible child under this section.
- 24 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 25 unless all of the following bills of the 101st Legislature are
- 26 enacted into law:
