## **SENATE BILL NO. 450**

May 18, 2021, Introduced by Senators STAMAS, SCHMIDT, HORN, BARRETT, LASATA and JOHNSON and referred to the Committee on Health Policy and Human Services.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending sections 2253 and 2453 (MCL 333.2253 and 333.2453), section 2253 as amended by 2006 PA 157.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2253. (1) ## Except as otherwise provided in subsection
- 2 (4), if the director determines that control of an epidemic is
- 3 necessary to protect the public health, the director by emergency

- 1 order may prohibit the gathering of people for any purpose and may
- 2 establish procedures to be followed during the epidemic to insure
- 3 ensure continuation of essential public health services and
- 4 enforcement of health laws. Emergency procedures shall are not be
- 5 limited to this code.
- **6** (2) If an epidemic described in subsection (1) involves avian
- 7 influenza or another virus or disease that is or may be spread by
- 8 contact with animals, the department of agriculture and rural
- 9 development shall cooperate with and assist the director in the
- 10 director's response to the epidemic.
- 11 (3) Upon On request from the director, the department of
- 12 agriculture and rural development shall assist the department in
- 13 any review or update of the department's pandemic influenza plan
- 14 under section 5112.
- 15 (4) Because LINDA, the director shall not issue an emergency
- 16 order under this section that does any of the following:
- 17 (a) Prohibits or otherwise limits a patient representative
- 18 from visiting a patient or resident in a qualified health care
- 19 facility. However, the emergency order may limit the number of
- 20 patient representatives who may visit a patient or resident in a
- 21 qualified health care facility at 1 time.
- 22 (b) Prohibits or otherwise limits a qualified health care
- 23 facility from implementing a reasonable safety measure before or
- 24 during a patient representative's visit to a patient or resident in
- 25 the qualified health care facility, including, but not limited to,
- 26 prescreening or testing a patient representative, imposing a visit
- 27 duration on a patient representative, restricting the number of
- 28 patient representatives who may visit at 1 time, and requiring a
- 29 patient representative to preschedule a visit.

- 2 (a) "Assisted living facility" means an unlicensed entity that
- 3 offers community-based residential care for at least 3 unrelated
- 4 adults who are 65 years of age or older or who need assistance with
- 5 activities of daily living that are available 24 hours a day,
- 6 including, but not limited to, personal, supportive, or
- 7 intermittent health-related services.
- 8 (b) "Family member" means an individual related to a patient
- 9 or resident by blood, marriage, or adoption who is within the fifth
- 10 degree of kinship to the patient or resident.
- 11 (c) "LINDA" means loved individuals need dedicated attention.
- (d) "Patient representative" means any of the following:
- 13 (i) A family member.
- 14 (ii) A patient advocate as that term is defined in section 1106
- 15 of the estates and protected individuals code, 1998 PA 386, MCL
- 16 700.1106.
- 17 (iii) An individual who is named as the attorney-in-fact under a
- 18 durable or nondurable power of attorney for the patient or
- 19 resident.
- 20 (e) "Qualified health care facility" means any of the
- 21 following:
- 22 (i) A health facility or agency as that term is defined in
- 23 section 20106.
- 24 (ii) An assisted living facility.
- 25 (iii) A physician's private practice office.
- Sec. 2453. (1) If Except as provided in subsection (3), if a
- 27 local health officer determines that control of an epidemic is
- 28 necessary to protect the public health, the local health officer
- 29 may issue an emergency order to prohibit the gathering of people

- 1 for any purpose and may establish procedures to be followed by
- 2 persons, including a local governmental entity, during the epidemic
- 3 to insure ensure continuation of essential public health services
- 4 and enforcement of health laws. Emergency procedures shall are not
- 5 be-limited to this code.
- **6** (2) A local health department or the department may provide
- 7 for the involuntary detention and treatment of individuals with
- 8 hazardous communicable disease in the manner prescribed in sections
- 9 5201 to <del>5238.</del>**5210.**
- 10 (3) Because LINDA, a local health officer shall not issue an 11 emergency order under this section that does any of the following:
- 12 (a) Prohibits or otherwise limits a patient representative
- 13 from visiting a patient or resident in a qualified health care
- 14 facility. However, the emergency order may limit the number of
- 15 patient representatives who may visit a patient or resident in a
- 16 qualified health care facility at 1 time.
- 17 (b) Prohibits or otherwise limits a qualified health care
- 18 facility from implementing a reasonable safety measure before or
- 19 during a patient representative's visit to a patient or resident in
- 20 the qualified health care facility, including, but not limited to,
- 21 prescreening or testing a patient representative, imposing a visit
- 22 duration on a patient representative, restricting the number of
- 23 patient representatives who may visit at 1 time, and requiring a
- 24 patient representative to preschedule a visit.
