SENATE BILL NO. 545

June 16, 2021, Introduced by Senator THEIS and referred to the Committee on Families, Seniors, and Veterans.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

by amending section 1166 (MCL 380.1166), as amended by 2016 PA 391, and by adding section 1166b.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1166. (1) In all public and nonpublic schools in this
 state regular courses of instruction shall must be given in the
- ${\tt 3}$ constitution Constitution of the United States, in the this state's
- 4 constitution, of Michigan, and in the history and present form of

- 1 government of the United States, Michigan, this state, and its
- 2 political subdivisions. Instruction shall must begin not later than
- 3 the opening of the eighth grade, grade 8, or its equivalent, except
- 4 in schools maintaining a junior high school, in which case it may
- 5 begin in the ninth grade.grade 9.
- 6 (2) A—Subject to section 1166b, a high school in this state
- 7 shall require a 1-semester course of study of 5 periods per week in
- 8 civics. The Subject to section 1166b, this course shall must
- 9 include the form and functions of the federal, state, and local
- 10 governments and shall must stress the rights and responsibilities
- 11 of citizens. A diploma shall must not be issued by a high school to
- 12 a pupil who has not successfully completed this course. This course
- 13 requirement is not a graduation requirement for a high school pupil
- 14 who has enlisted or been inducted into military service.
- 15 (3) By not later than May 1, 2018 or the next update of the
- 16 state curriculum content standards after the effective date of this
- 17 subsection, March 29, 2017, whichever occurs first, the state board
- 18 shall revise the state curriculum content standards for high school
- 19 social studies to ensure that those content standards cover the
- 20 same content as covered by the 100 questions on the civics portion
- 21 of the naturalization test used by the United States Citizenship
- 22 and Immigration Services as of December 1, 2016.
- 23 (4) Beginning with the first state high school social studies
- 24 assessment administered after the state academic curriculum content
- 25 standards are revised as required under subsection (3), the
- 26 superintendent of public instruction shall ensure that the high
- 27 school social studies assessment includes questions related to the
- 28 learning objectives in the state curriculum content standards for
- 29 high school social studies as revised under subsection (3).

- 1 (5) As used in this section, "state curriculum content
- 2 standards" means the state board recommended model core academic
- 3 curriculum content standards developed and periodically updated
- 4 under section 1278.
- 5 Sec. 1166b. Beginning on the effective date of the amendatory
- 6 act that added this section, the board of a school district or
- 7 intermediate school district, board of directors of a public school
- 8 academy, or governing body of a nonpublic school that operates a
- 9 high school in this state shall ensure that the course required
- 10 under section 1166(2) that is provided to pupils enrolled in the
- 11 high school includes coverage of, at a minimum, all of the
- 12 following:
- 13 (a) Information concerning the process by which a pupil may
- 14 obtain an official state personal identification card issued by the
- 15 secretary of state under 1972 PA 222, MCL 28.291 to 28.300.
- 16 (b) Information that includes a breakdown of how a pupil can
- 17 access 1972 PA 222, MCL 28.291 to 28.300, on the internet,
- 18 including, but not limited to, providing the pupil with a link
- 19 through which the pupil can access 1972 PA 222, MCL 28.291 to
- 20 28.300.
- 21 (c) The contact information for both of the following:
- 22 (i) The office of the secretary of state.
- 23 (ii) The branch offices of the secretary of state located in
- 24 the intermediate school district in which the pupils reside.
