## **SENATE BILL NO. 729**

November 10, 2021, Introduced by Senator NESBITT and referred to the Committee on Energy and Technology.

A bill to amend 1893 PA 206, entitled "The general property tax act,"

(MCL 211.1 to 211.155) by adding section 9q.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 9q. (1) Beginning December 31, 2021, both of the
- 2 following are exempt from the collection of taxes under this act:
- 3 (a) Eligible broadband equipment that resolves lack of
- 4 broadband service provided by a qualified business that has been
- 5 selected to receive, provisionally or otherwise, funding to support

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- 1 the expansion of broadband networks from the Federal Communications
- 2 Commission, the United States Department of Agriculture, or this
- 3 state.
- 4 (b) Eligible broadband equipment that resolves lack of
- 5 broadband service by delivering high-speed internet access at
- 6 speeds of at least 100 megabits per second downstream and 10
- 7 megabits per second upstream.
- 8 (2) To claim the exemption under this section, a qualified
- 9 business must file a statement from an officer of the qualified
- 10 business, or otherwise provide similar certification in a form and
- 11 manner prescribed by the department of treasury, specifically
- 12 describing the equipment for which the exemption is claimed and
- 13 certifying that all of the requirements for the exemption under
- 14 this section are met as to that equipment. The statement or other
- 15 similar certification must be filed with the department of treasury
- 16 by not later than February 20 of each year that the exemption is
- 17 claimed.
- 18 (3) As used in this section:
- (a) "Eligible broadband equipment" means any personal property
- 20 acquired by a qualified business, including, but not limited to,
- 21 fiber-optic and coaxial cable, conduits, pole attachment hardware,
- 22 cabinets, pedestals, amplifiers, routers, servers, multiplexers,
- 23 antennae, and related equipment, that meets both of the following:
- 24 (i) Is used in the transmission or receipt of data in at least
- 25 1 direction.
- 26 (ii) Was first installed by the qualified business after
- 27 December 31, 2021 and before December 31, 2026, and has been used
- 28 by the qualified business for not more than 10 years.
- 29 (b) "Lack of broadband service" means either no terrestrial

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- 1 internet access or access to terrestrial internet delivered at
- 2 speeds of less than 25 megabits per second downstream and 3
- 3 megabits per second upstream. For purposes of this definition, a
- 4 person may experience lack of broadband service regardless of any
- 5 access the person may have to satellite internet.
- 6 (c) "Person" means an individual, sole proprietorship,
- 7 partnership, corporation, association, limited liability company,
- 8 or any other legal entity.
- 9 (d) "Qualified business" means a person that provides
- 10 terrestrial broadband service, including terrestrial wireless
- 11 broadband service.
- 12 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 13 after the date it is enacted into law.
