## **SENATE BILL NO. 1108**

June 30, 2022, Introduced by Senators IRWIN, BAYER, GEISS and CHANG and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 2018 IL 1, entitled "Michigan Regulation and Taxation of Marihuana Act," by amending section 11 (MCL 333.27961).

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 11. (1) (a) A marihuana establishment may shall not allow cultivation, processing, sale, do any of the following:
- (a) Cultivate, process, sell, or display of marihuana or sell
   or display marihuana accessories to be if the cultivating,
- 5 processing, selling, or displaying is visible from a public place

- 1 outside of the marihuana establishment without the use of
- 2 binoculars, aircraft, or other optical aids.
- 3 (b) A marihuana establishment may not cultivate, Cultivate,
- 4 process, test, or store marihuana at any location other than a
- 5 physical address approved by the department. and within an enclosed
- 6 area that is secured in a manner that prevents access by persons
- 7 not permitted by the marihuana establishment to access the area.
- 8 (c) Allow an individual who is younger than 21 years of age to yolunteer or work for the marihuana establishment.
- 10 (d) Sell or otherwise transfer marihuana that was not
- 11 produced, distributed, and taxed in compliance with this act.
- 12 (e) Sell or otherwise transfer a marihuana accessory that has
- 13 a heating element unless the heating element is made of or encased
- 14 in 1 or both of the following:
- 15 (i) Glass.
- 16 (ii) Ceramic.
- 17 (f) Sell or otherwise transfer tobacco.
- 18 (2) A marihuana establishment shall secure comply with all of
- 19 the following:
- 20 (a) Cultivate, process, test, and store marihuana within an
- 21 enclosed area that is secured in a manner that prevents access by
- 22 persons not allowed by the marihuana establishment to access the
- 23 area.
- 24 (b) Secure every entrance to the marihuana establishment so
- 25 that access to areas containing marihuana is restricted to
- 26 employees—only the following:
- 27 (i) Employees and other persons permitted allowed by the
- 28 marihuana establishment to access the area. and to agents
- 29 (ii) Agents of the department marijuana regulatory agency. or

- 2 (iii) State and local law enforcement officers and emergency
  3 personnel. and shall secure
- 4 (c) Secure its inventory and equipment during and after
  5 operating hours to deter and prevent theft of marihuana and
  6 marihuana accessories.
- 7 (d) No marihuana establishment may refuse representatives
  8 Allow agents of the department the right marijuana regulatory
  9 agency during the marihuana establishment's hours of operation to
  10 inspect the licensed premises or to audit the books and records of
  11 the marihuana establishment.
- (e) No marihuana establishment may allow a person under 21
  years of age to volunteer or work for the marihuana establishment.
- (f) No marihuana establishment may sell or otherwise transfer
  marihuana that was not produced, distributed, and taxed in
  compliance with this act.
  - (3) (g)—A marihuana grower, marihuana retailer, marihuana processor, marihuana microbusiness, or marihuana testing facility or agents acting on their behalf may its agent shall not transport more than 15 ounces of marihuana or more than 60 grams of marihuana concentrate at one—1 time.
- (4) (h) A marihuana secure transporter may shall not hold
   title to marihuana.
  - (5) (i) No A marihuana processor may shall not process and no a marihuana retailer may shall not sell edible marihuana-infused candy in shapes or packages that are attractive to children or that are easily confused with commercially sold candy that does not contain marihuana.
    - (6) (j) No A marihuana retailer may shall not sell or

- 1 otherwise transfer marihuana that unless it is not contained in an
- 2 opaque, resealable, child-resistant package designed to be
- 3 significantly difficult for children under younger than 5 years of
- 4 age to open and not difficult for normal adults to use properly as
- 5 defined by 16 C.F.R. 1700.20 (1995), provided for under 16 CFR
- 6 1700.20, unless the marihuana is transferred for consumption on the
- 7 premises where sold.
- 8 (k) No marihuana establishment may sell or otherwise transfer
- 9 tobacco.
