## **SENATE BILL NO. 1176**

September 20, 2022, Introduced by Senator RUNESTAD and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to designate the period beginning on September 11 through September 17 of each year as Patriot Week in this state.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. (1) The legislature recognizes that understanding
- 2 American history and America's First Principles are indispensable
- 3 to the survival of our republic as a free people. In great
- 4 reverence to the victims of the September 11, 2001 attacks, the
- 5 legislature acknowledges that American citizens must take time to
- 6 honor the First Principles, founders, documents, and symbols of
- 7 their history. The events that led to the signing of the
- 8 Constitution of the United States of America by the delegates of

- 1 the Constitutional Convention on September 17, 1787 have
- 2 significance for every American and are honored in public schools
- 3 across the nation on September 17 of each year as Constitution Day.
- 4 Revolution, the rule of law, the social compact, equality,
- 5 unalienable rights, and limited government are the First Principles
- 6 upon which America was founded and flourishes. Exceptional,
- 7 visionary, and indispensable Americans such as Thomas Paine,
- 8 Patrick Henry, John Adams, John Marshall, George Washington,
- 9 Abraham Lincoln, Frederick Douglass, Martin Luther King, Jr.,
- 10 Elizabeth Cady Stanton, Susan B. Anthony, Thomas Jefferson, and
- 11 James Madison founded and advanced the United States. The
- 12 Declaration of Independence, the Constitution and the Congressional
- 13 resolution forwarding the Constitution to the states, Marbury v
- 14 Madison, Seneca Falls Declaration of Sentiments and Resolutions,
- 15 the Gettysburg Address, the Emancipation Proclamation, and the I
- 16 Have A Dream speech are key documents that embody America's First
- 17 Principles and have advanced American liberty. The Bennington flag,
- 18 the original Betsy Ross American flag, the current American flag,
- 19 the Suffragist flag, the Fort Sumter flag, the Gadsden flag, and
- 20 the flag of the state of Michigan are key physical symbols of
- 21 American history and freedom that should be studied and remembered
- 22 by each American. Recognizing that each generation needs to renew
- 23 the spirit of America based on America's First Principles, key
- 24 historical figures, founding documents, and symbols, the
- 25 legislature declares that the period beginning on September 11
- 26 through September 17 of each year shall be known as "Patriot Week"
- 27 that symbolically begins on September 11 and concludes on September
- 28 17, Constitution Day.
- 29 (2) The legislature encourages citizens, schools and other

- 2 nonprofit, religious, labor, community, and business organizations
- 3 to recognize and participate in Patriot Week by honoring and
- 4 celebrating the First Principles, key historical figures, founding
- 5 documents, and symbols of America to renew the spirit of America.
