SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION Q

June 23, 2022, Introduced by Senators POLEHANKI, BAYER, BRINKS, GEISS, WOJNO, MCMORROW, SANTANA, MOSS, MCCANN, CHANG and HERTEL and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A joint resolution proposing an amendment to the state constitution of 1963, by amending section 11 of article IX, to revise the permissible uses for the state school aid fund.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the state of Michigan, That the following amendment to the state constitution of 1963, to revise the permissible uses for the state school aid fund, is proposed, agreed to, and submitted to the people of the state:

1	ARTICLE	ΙX

2 Sec. 11. There shall be established a state school aid fund 3 which shall be used exclusively for aid to school districts τ higher education, and school employees' retirement systems, as 4 5 provided by law. Sixty percent of all taxes imposed at a rate of 4% 6 on retailers on taxable sales at retail of tangible personal 7 property, 100% of the proceeds of the sales and use taxes imposed 8 at the additional rate of 2% provided for in section 8 of this 9 article, and other tax revenues provided by law, shall be dedicated 10 to this fund. Payments from this fund shall be made in full on a 11 scheduled basis, as provided by law. Beginning in the 1995-96 state 12 fiscal year and each state fiscal year after 1995-96, the state 13 shall guarantee that the total state and local per pupil revenue 14 for school operating purposes for each local school district shall 15 not be less than the 1994-95 total state and local per pupil 16 revenue for school operating purposes for that local school 17 district, as adjusted for consolidations, annexations, or other 18 boundary changes. However, this guarantee does not apply in a year 19 in which the local school district levies a millage rate for school 20 district operating purposes less than it levied in 1994. 21 Resolved further, That the foregoing amendment shall be 22 submitted to the people of the state at the next general election 23 in the manner provided by law.
