- 1 A resolution to declare October 2021 as Library Appreciation
- 2 Month in the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas, The Michigan Library Association (MLA) annually
- 4 designates the month of October as a statewide observance to
- 5 celebrate the contributions of Michigan's libraries, librarians,
- 6 and library staff; and
- 7 Whereas, Michigan's libraries (school, public, academic,
- 8 tribal, cooperatives, and special libraries) are vital, dynamic
- 9 centers of discovery and lifelong learning, serving as cornerstones
- 10 in healthy communities; and
- 11 Whereas, Librarians and library workers play key roles in

- 1 connecting their community members to resources and information,
- 2 helping people explore, imagine, and discover new horizons in the
- 3 vast world of information, knowledge, and entertainment; and
- 4 Whereas, Today's libraries are less about what they have on
- 5 the shelves and more about what they can do with and for their
- 6 communities, whether it's through virtual services or in-person
- 7 visits; and
- 8 Whereas, Libraries and librarians work to create an equitable
- 9 society by providing free access to accurate information to all
- 10 people; and
- 11 Whereas, In times of crisis, libraries and library staff play
- 12 a critical role in continuing to support their communities when
- 13 they need it the most; and
- 14 Whereas, Libraries bring together diverse populations and are
- 15 a resource for all members of the community regardless of race,
- 16 ethnicity, creed, ability, sexual orientation, gender identity, or
- 17 socio-economic status; and
- 18 Whereas, Libraries strive to develop and maintain programs and
- 19 collections that are as diverse as the populations they serve; and
- 20 Whereas, Libraries serve as a vital connection to the people,
- 21 places, and ideas of the world through books, magazines, videos,
- 22 and the Internet and are the primary point of online access for
- 23 people without computers at home, school, or work; and
- 24 Whereas, Libraries provide indispensable educational resources
- 25 for children and teenagers and are on the front lines in the battle
- 26 against illiteracy, offering plenty of free activities, as well as
- 27 safe, enriching entertainment for the whole family; and
- 28 Whereas, One-half of all Michiganders hold library cards, and
- 29 in 2020, visited their local libraries in-person more than 33

million times, virtually nearly 55 million times, and borrowed over 1 57 million physical items and close to 12 million e-materials; and 2 Whereas, In 2020, Michigan public libraries provided more than 3 13,000 live virtual programs for children, teens, and adults 4 reaching over 608,000 people; and 5 6 Whereas, During the worldwide pandemic in 2020, 76% of 7 Michigan's public libraries offered curbside services and 82% 8 continued to provide reference services via phone and internet -9 providing a way to continue getting information and materials to 10 residents even when library buildings were closed to the public; 11 and 12 Whereas, Hundreds of libraries and millions of library 13 supporters across Michigan are celebrating Michigan Library 14 Appreciation Month this October; now, therefore, be it 15 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of 16 this legislative body declare October 2021 as Michigan Library Appreciation Month in the state of Michigan. We encourage all 17 18 residents to visit their library in person or virtually to connect

to the myriad of services, resources, and collections their library
