Reps. Hornberger, Harris, Lightner, Fink, Borton, Green, Rendon, Allor, Roth, Bollin, Calley, Steven Johnson, Martin, LaFave, Slagh, Yaroch, Bezotte, Outman, Eisen and Whiteford offered the following resolution:

1 A resolution to condemn the Michigan Department of Education's

2 teacher training videos on student gender orientation and reaffirm

3 the fundamental right of parents to direct the education of their

5 Whereas, The fundamental right of parents over the upbringing

of their children has been unequivocally established in the United

States. Parents are in the best position to know their children's

8 needs and circumstances, and therefore should maintain authority

9 over all information and decisions that could impact the health and

10 well-being of their children; and

Whereas, Portions of the Michigan Department of Education's 1 LGBTQ teacher training videos suggest not telling parents their 2 child's gender orientation, sexual orientation, or pronouns. These 3 videos train teachers that they do not have to disclose a child's 4 5 gender or sexual orientation even if it is contributing to the 6 child's suicidal thoughts. This not only puts a child's life at 7 risk, but it also denies parents their fundamental right to protect 8 the health and safety of their children. Further, this is an all-9 out affront to our constitution that clearly establishes that 10 parental rights are sacred and secured. The offensive nature of 11 these videos clearly represents the out of touch perspective of the Michigan Department of Education and this Administration who 12 13 routinely demonstrate their disdain for parents and parents' 14 rights; and 15 Whereas, Parents' fundamental right to direct the care, 16 teaching, and education of their children is infringed upon when school districts do not have total transparency and do not defer to 17 18 parents regarding their children's gender identity, sexual 19 orientation, preferred pronouns, or any other issue related to 20 their child's gender identity known to the school. Parents have the 21 right to direct any discussion regarding these topics with their children. Michigan's public schools should not promote exploration 22 23 of gender identity, gender fluidity, or sexual orientation without 24 parental consent. These topics are highly sensitive and, at the 25 very least, require active involvement of parents who are the primary principals in their children's development; now, therefore, 26 27 be it 28 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That we condemn the 29 Michigan Department of Education's teacher training videos on

- 1 student gender orientation and reaffirm the fundamental right of
- 2 parents to direct the education of their children; and be it
