HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.30

Reps. Steven Johnson, Markkanen, Beson, Martin, Maddock, LaFave, Carra and Bellino offered the following resolution:

A resolution to encourage the National Park Service to
establish a moose tag lottery hunt to assist in controlling the
moose population on Isle Royale.

Whereas, Isle Royale National Park in Michigan is home to anexploding population of moose. The Michigan Technological

6 University Wolf Study 2018-2019 Annual Report estimates moose have

increased sharply from a population of 515 in 2011 to 2,060 in

8 2019, an average growth rate greater than 19 percent annually; and

9 Whereas, Issues with the moose-to-wolf ratio over the last

10 several decades have now reached a tipping point, with a current

11 population of only 12 to 14 wolves on Isle Royale as of March 2020.

12 Wolves are the only natural predator of moose on Isle Royale but

- 1 the diminishing wolf population have not contained the moose
- 2 population in recent years; and
- 3 Whereas, The increased and unsustainable moose population on
- 4 Isle Royale has created an ongoing ecological dilemma as the moose
- 5 feed on the park's balsam fir trees and other vegetation. The
- 6 rapidly expanding moose herd will devastate these slow-growing
- 7 trees and could eliminate them from Isle Royale. In turn, over
- 8 foraging by the moose population has reduced their food supply,
- 9 causing moose to starve to death. A slight decline in the moose
- 10 population during the winter of 2020 has been partially attributed
- 11 to over foraging; and
- 12 Whereas, Previous attempts to introduce additional wolves to
- 13 balance out the moose-to-wolf ratio have not resulted in a long-
- 14 term sustainable balance of predator and prey; and
- 15 Whereas, A moose tag lottery hunt will benefit Isle Royale
- 16 National Park and help restore ecological balance among moose,
- 17 wolves, and vegetation. Approximately forty national parks
- 18 currently allow some form of hunting as part of their wildlife
- 19 management practices; and
- 20 Whereas, This hunt will provide a unique hunting experience
- 21 for a number of hunters each year, which in turn will bring
- 22 increased economic activity to the western Upper Peninsula; now,
- 23 therefore, be it
- 24 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That we encourage
- 25 the National Park Service to establish a moose tag lottery hunt to
- 26 assist in controlling the moose population on Isle Royale; and be
- 27 it further
- 28 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the
- 29 Director of the National Park Service, the members of the Michigan

- 1 congressional delegation, the Director of the Michigan Department
- 2 of Natural Resources, and the Governor of Michigan.
