HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.173

Rep. Posthumus offered the following resolution: 1 A resolution to declare October 2021 as Library Appreciation 2 Month in the state of Michigan. 3 Whereas, The Michigan Library Association (MLA) annually designates the month of October as a statewide observance to 4 celebrate the contributions of Michigan's libraries, librarians, 5 6 and library staff; and 7 Whereas, Michigan's libraries (school, public, academic, 8 tribal, cooperatives, and special libraries) are vital, dynamic centers of discovery and lifelong learning, serving as cornerstones 9 in healthy communities; and 10 Whereas, Librarians and library workers play key roles in 11 12 connecting their community members to resources and information, 13 helping people explore, imagine, and discover new horizons in the

vast world of information, knowledge, and entertainment; and 1 Whereas, Today's libraries are less about what they have on 2 3 the shelves and more about what they can do with and for their communities, whether it's through virtual services or in-person 4 5 visits; and 6 Whereas, Libraries and librarians work to create an equitable 7 society by providing free access to accurate information to all people; and 8 9 Whereas, In times of crisis, libraries and library staff play a critical role in continuing to support their communities when 10 11 they need it the most; and Whereas, Libraries bring together diverse populations and are 12 a resource for all members of the community regardless of race, 13 14 ethnicity, creed, ability, sexual orientation, gender identity, or 15 socio-economic status; and 16 Whereas, Libraries strive to develop and maintain programs and 17 collections that are as diverse as the populations they serve; and 18 Whereas, Libraries serve as a vital connection to the people, 19 places, and ideas of the world through books, magazines, videos, 20 and the Internet and are the primary point of online access for 21 people without computers at home, school, or work; and 22 Whereas, Libraries provide indispensable educational resources 23 for children and teenagers and are on the front lines in the battle against illiteracy, offering plenty of free activities, as well as 24 25 safe, enriching entertainment for the whole family; and Whereas, One-half of all Michiganders hold library cards, and 26 27 in 2020, visited their local libraries in-person more than 33

million times, virtually nearly 55 million times, and borrowed over

57 million physical items and close to 12 million e-materials; and

Whereas, In 2020, Michigan public libraries provided more than 1 2 13,000 live virtual programs for children, teens, and adults reaching over 608,000 people; and 3 4 Whereas, During the worldwide pandemic in 2020, 76% of Michigan's public libraries offered curbside services and 82% 5 6 continued to provide reference services via phone and internet -7 providing a way to continue getting information and materials to 8 residents even when library buildings were closed to the public; 9 and 10 Whereas, Hundreds of libraries and millions of library 11 supporters across Michigan are celebrating Michigan Library 12 Appreciation Month this October; now, therefore, be it 13 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of 14 this legislative body declare October 2021 as Michigan Library 15 Appreciation Month in the state of Michigan. We encourage all 16 residents to visit their library in person or virtually to connect to the myriad of services, resources, and collections their library 17
