## SENATE RESOLUTION NO.135

Senators Santana, Wojno, Brinks, Bayer, McMorrow, Polehanki, Hollier, Bullock, Outman, Huizenga, Nesbitt, Theis, Barrett, VanderWall, Runestad, Chang and Schmidt offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to recognize April 28, 2022, as Survivors Speak
- 2 Michigan Day, a part of National Crime Victims Rights' Week.
- 3 Whereas, Survivors Speak Michigan is organized by Crime
- 4 Survivors for Safety and Justice and the Alliance for Safety and
- 5 Justice; and
- 6 Whereas, Crime and violence can harm any individual and
- 7 community, regardless of age, national origin, race, creed,
- 8 religion, gender, sexual orientation, immigration, or economic
- 9 status; and

- 3 Whereas, Only eight percent of all victims of violence receive
- 4 direct assistance from a victim service agency. This drops to four
- 5 percent when the crime is unreported, which is the case for more
- 6 than half of all violent crimes; and
- 7 Whereas, Through their experiences, crime survivors are
- 8 uniquely qualified to provide essential input and influence in
- 9 discussions of public safety and criminal justice policy; and
- 10 Whereas, Michigan must address the immediate safety concerns
- 11 facing families and invest in a long-term, comprehensive plan to
- 12 address root causes of violence; and
- 13 Whereas, The voices and experiences of survivors are too often
- 14 ignored, leading to poor policy and justice system decisions that
- 15 fail to meet the needs of survivors or stop the cycle of crime; and
- 16 Whereas, Our state must support trauma recovery centers that
- 17 play a critical role and resource for survivors impacted by crime;
- **18** and
- 19 Whereas, Crime survivors understand existing gaps to recovery
- 20 and how to bridge them; and
- 21 Whereas, Survivors want a system of justice and safety that
- 22 prioritizes prevention, rehabilitation, and trauma recovery; and
- 23 Whereas, Michigan needs to invest in programs that provide
- 24 assistance to crime victims and their families to effectively deal
- 25 with the inherent trauma and residual effects of violence; now,
- 26 therefore, be it
- 27 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 28 body recognize April 28, 2022, as Survivors Speak Michigan Day, a
- 29 part of National Crime Victims Rights' Week; and be it further

- 1 Resolved, That we commend the survivors and advocates of
- 2 Survivors Speak Michigan for their work to stop violence and help
- 3 those impacted by it.
