## **SUMMARY:**

House Bill 4288 would amend section 15 of 1947 PA 336 to remove references to a repealed section of the Revised School Code (section 1280c) <sup>1</sup> that, among other things, affected how districts designated as low performing under certain state metrics engaged in collective bargaining and entered into collective bargaining agreements.

The bill is tie-barred to HB 4166, which means that it will not take effect unless HB 4166 is also enacted into law.

## **BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:**

House Bill 4288 serves as a companion bill to HB 4166,<sup>2</sup> which would repeal a requirement that the Michigan Department of Education issue A-to-F grades for public schools based on certain metrics and issue rankings based on those grades. While section 1280c of the Revised School Code has already been repealed, the A-to-F system that would be repealed by HB 4166 is referenced indirectly in the provisions amended by HB 4288, as the low performing schools were determined through the A-to-F grades and rankings.

## **FISCAL IMPACT:**

The bill would have no fiscal impact on the state or on school districts, intermediate school districts (ISDs), or public school academies (PSAs, or charter schools).
