SUMMARY:

House Bill 4579 would amend the Insurance Code to require an insurer to provide the same coverage for services provided through *telemedicine* as if the service were in person (i.e., involved face-to-face contact between the health care professional and the patient).

Telemedicine means the use of an electronic media to link patients with health care professionals in different locations. To be considered telemedicine, the health care professional must be able to examine the patient via a Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA)—compliant, secure interactive audio or video, or both, telecommunications system, or through the use of store and forward online messaging.

This requirement would apply to health insurance policies that are delivered, executed, issued, amended, adjusted, or renewed in Michigan (or outside of Michigan if covering Michigan residents) beginning on the date the bill takes effect.
