#### **SUMMARY:**

**House Bill 4603** would amend 1937 PA 306, which governs the construction of school buildings.

Currently, a school building or its additions cannot be erected, remodeled, or reconstructed without having the plans prepared by an architect or professional engineer licensed in Michigan (unless otherwise specified in the rules on used modular classrooms promulgated by the director of the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA)). The act also prescribes requirements and prohibitions related to the construction of a school building, for example requiring the use of fire resistant material for walls and floors.

The bill would remove the provisions described above and instead provide that a school building or its additions cannot be erected, remodeled, or reconstructed unless the plans and specifications are prepared by either of the following:

- An architect or professional engineer licensed in Michigan.
- An architect or professional engineer licensed in Michigan in conjunction with a *design-builder* if the design-builder either meets the licensing requirements to practice architecture in Michigan or forms a *design-build team*.

**Design-builder** would mean an entity that provides **design-build** construction services.

**Design-build team** would mean a team consisting of a design-build contractor and an architect or professional engineer licensed in Michigan.

**Design-build construction services** would mean a project delivery method that meets all of the following requirements:

- A school district engages the services of a criteria developer, <sup>1</sup> an architect, or a professional engineer who is licensed in Michigan to do both of the following:
  - Assist the school district in the selection and compensation of a designbuild team or design-builder.
  - Provide for the scope of the services of a design-build team or designbuilder.
- A school district contracts with a single individual or entity for both design and construction services.

- Design and construction of the project is either sequential (with the entire design complete before construction commences) or concurrent (with the design produced in two or more phases and construction of some phases commencing before the entire design is complete).
- Selection is a single-phase selection using price and qualification to determine best value.

**Construction** would mean the construction, erection, reconstruction, alteration, conversion, demolition, repair, moving, or equipping of buildings or structures.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

House Bill 4603 is similar to HB 5538 of the 2021-22 legislative session, which was passed by the House.<sup>2</sup>

### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

House Bill 4603 would have an indeterminate fiscal impact on school construction costs. The cost differential associated with changes under the bill would need to be examined on a case-by-case basis, and is therefore indeterminate. However, the bill may result in reduced project costs.
