SUMMARY:

House Bill 4981 would amend the Michigan Election Law to require an individual to meet one or both of the following qualifications in order to be eligible for election as a county sheriff:

- The individual has been a licensed law enforcement officer under the Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standards (MCOLES) Act for at least five years.
- The individual has been employed by a county sheriff in a local correctional facility as a corrections officer, supervisor, or administrator for at least five years and is certified by the Michigan Sheriffs' Coordinating and Training Council (MSCTC).

Current officeholders would be exempt from these requirements.
