SUMMARY:

<u>House Bill 5167</u> would amend the Social Welfare Act to provide that an individual who is pregnant or is within a postpartum period is eligible for medical assistance coverage of a blood pressure monitor designed for use during pregnancy and fitted to the individual.

Proposed MCL 400.109o

<u>House Bill 5168</u> would amend the Insurance Code to require insurers that deliver, issue for delivery, or renew a health insurance policy in Michigan to cover a blood pressure monitor for a pregnant or postpartum insured individual, subject to applicable cost sharing, including deductible, co-insurance, or co-pay provisions.

FISCAL IMPACT:

House Bill 5167 would incur an upper-bound estimated cost of \$2.5 million Gross (\$855,300 GF/GP)¹ per year for the Michigan Medicaid program, assuming that every eligible recipient receives a Medicaid-provided blood pressure monitor. Medicaid reimbursements for automatic blood pressure monitors are \$62.30² per monitor, as of July 2023. The number of births financed by Medicaid in Michigan in 2021 totaled 39,585 individuals³ and was used as a proxy variable for the number of pregnant women that would be eligible for the Medicaid-provided blood pressure monitors.

<u>House Bill 5168</u> would not have a fiscal impact on the Department of Insurance and Financial Services or on other units of state or local government.
