SUMMARY:

House Bill 5722 would eliminate the requirement that an individual be at least 21 years old to transport hazardous materials in a commercial motor vehicle in the state of Michigan in an amount that requires the vehicle to be marked or placarded under federal regulations.¹

Under the bill, an individual would have to be 18 to operate a commercial vehicle in these circumstances.

An individual would still be required to be at least 21 years old to operate a commercial motor vehicle across state lines, regardless of what is being transported.²

The bill would have no fiscal impact on the state or local units of government.
