SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4320

A bill to amend 1931 PA 328, entitled "The Michigan penal code,"

(MCL 750.1 to 750.568) by adding section 145h.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 145h. (1) A person shall not intentionally or knowingly
- 2 harass, abuse, threaten, force, coerce, compel, or exploit the
- 3 vulnerability of a vulnerable adult in a manner that causes the
- 4 vulnerable adult to provide that person, or any other person,
- 5 sexually explicit visual material.
- 6 (2) Except as provided in subsection (3), a person who
- 7 violates subsection (1) is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by
- 8 imprisonment for not more than 1 year or a fine of not more than
- 9 \$500.00, or both.

- 1 (3) A person who violates subsection (1) who has 1 or more 2 prior convictions for a violation of subsection (1) is guilty of a 3 felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 2 years or a
- 5 (4) If the prosecuting attorney intends to seek an enhanced 6 sentence based upon the defendant having 1 or more prior
- 7 convictions, the prosecuting attorney shall include on the
- 8 complaint and information a statement listing the prior conviction
- 9 or convictions. The existence of the defendant's prior conviction
- 10 or convictions must be determined by the court, without a jury, at
- 11 sentencing or at a separate hearing for that purpose before
- 12 sentencing. The existence of a prior conviction may be established
- 13 by any evidence relevant for that purpose, including, but not
- 14 limited to, 1 or more of the following:
- 15 (a) A copy of the judgment of conviction.

fine of not more than \$1,000.00, or both.

- (b) A transcript of a prior trial, plea-taking, or sentencing.
- 17 (c) Information contained in a presentence report.
- 18 (d) The defendant's statement.
- 19 (5) As used in this section:
- 20 (a) "Sexually explicit visual material" means that term as 21 defined in section 145e.
- 22 (b) "Vulnerable adult" means that term as defined in section 23 145m.
- Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days after the date it is enacted into law.
