## HOUSE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 931

A bill to amend 1997 PA 70, entitled "Compulsive gaming prevention act,"

by amending section 3 (MCL 432.253), as amended by 2008 PA 282.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 3. (1) The compulsive gaming prevention fund is created
  within the department of treasury.
- 3 (2) All of the following shall must be deposited in the 4 compulsive gaming prevention fund:
- 5 (a) The money appropriated from the state services fee fund 6 created in section 12a of the Michigan gaming control and revenue 7 act, 1996 IL 1, MCL 432.212a, for the compulsive gaming prevention 8 fund.
- 9 (b) A percentage of the net revenue in the state lottery fund

- 1 created in section 41 of the McCauley-Traxler-Law-Bowman-McNeely
- 2 lottery act, 1972 PA 239, MCL 432.41, that is equal to not less
- 3 than 10% of each year's state lottery advertising budget but not to
- 4 exceed \$1,000,000.00.\$2,000,000.00.
- 5 (c) A percentage of the Michigan agriculture equine industry
- 6 development fund created in section 20 of the horse racing law of
- 7 1995, 1995 PA 279, MCL 431.320, that is equal to  $\frac{1}{10}$  1/15 of 1% of
- 8 the gross wagers made each year in each of the racetracks licensed
- 9 under the horse racing law of 1995, 1995 PA 279, MCL 431.301 to
- **10** 431.336.
- 11 (d) The money appropriated from the internet gaming fund
- 12 created in section 16 of the lawful internet gaming act, 2019 PA
- 13 152, MCL 432.316, for the compulsive gaming prevention fund.
- 14 (e) The money appropriated from the internet sports betting
- 15 fund created in section 16 of the lawful sports betting act, 2019
- 16 PA 149, MCL 432.416, for the compulsive gaming prevention fund.
- 17 (3) Of the money available in the compulsive gaming prevention
- 18 fund, up to \$1,040,000.00 \$1,040,500.00 may be distributed annually
- 19 to the domestic and sexual violence prevention and treatment board
- 20 created in section 2 of 1978 PA 389, MCL 400.1502. The remaining
- 21 money in the compulsive gaming prevention fund shall must be
- 22 distributed as determined by the director of community the
- 23 department of health and human services to be used exclusively for
- 24 the treatment, prevention, education, training, research, and
- 25 evaluation of pathological gamblers and their families and to fund
- 26 the toll-free compulsive gaming helpline number.
- 27 (4) The state treasurer may receive money or other assets
- 28 required to be paid into the fund under this act or from any other
- 29 source for deposit into the fund. The state treasurer shall direct

- 1 the investment of the fund. The state treasurer shall credit to the
- 2 fund interest and earnings from fund investments.
- 3 (5) Money remaining in the compulsive gaming prevention fund
- 4 at the close of the fiscal year shall must remain in the compulsive
- 5 gaming prevention fund and shall must not lapse to the general
- 6 fund.
- 7 (6) The department of community health and human services may
- 8 establish fees for the treatment of pathological gambling
- 9 addictions.
