THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 20 (f) An object specifically designed for use in ingesting,
- 21 inhaling, or otherwise introducing marihuana, cocaine, hashish, or
- 22 hashish oil into the human body.
- 23 (g) A kit specifically designed for use in planting,
- 24 propagating, cultivating, growing, or harvesting any species of
- 25 plant which that is a controlled substance or from which a
- 26 controlled substance can be derived.
- 27 (h) A kit specifically designed for use in manufacturing,
- 28 compounding, converting, producing, processing, or preparing
- 29 controlled substances.

(i) A device, commonly known as a cocaine kit, that is
specifically designed for use in ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise

- 4 consists of at least a razor blade and a mirror.
- 5 (j) A device, commonly known as a bullet, that is specifically6 designed to deliver a measured amount of controlled substances to
- 7 the user.

- 8 (k) A device, commonly known as a snorter, that is
 9 specifically designed to carry a small amount of controlled
 10 substances to the user's nose.
- (l) A device, commonly known as an automotive safe, that is specifically designed to carry and conceal a controlled substance in an automobile, including, but not limited to, a can used for brake fluid, oil, or carburetor cleaner which that contains a compartment for carrying and concealing controlled substances.
- (m) A spoon, with or without a chain attached, that has a small diameter bowl and that is specifically designed for use in ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing controlled substances into the human body.
 - (2) As used in sections 7453 to 7461 and section 7521, "drug paraphernalia" does not include testing products utilized in determining whether a controlled substance contains chemicals, toxic substances, or hazardous compounds in quantities that can cause physical harm or death. As used in this subsection, "testing products" includes, but is not limited to, fentanyl testing strips.
