SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4363

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending sections 10105 and 10120 (MCL 333.10105 and 333.10120), section 10105 as amended and section 10120 as added by 2008 PA 39.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 10105. (1) A donor may make an anatomical gift by doing 2 any of the following:
- 3 (a) By authorizing a statement or symbol indicating that the
 4 donor has made an anatomical gift to be imprinted on the donor's
 5 driver license or identification card.
- 6 (b) In a will.
- 7 (c) During a terminal illness or injury of the donor, by any
- 8 form of communication addressed to at least 2 adults, at least 1 of

- 1 whom is a disinterested witness. However, the physician who attends
- 2 the donor during the terminal illness or injury shall not act as a
- 3 recipient of the communication under this subdivision.
- 4 (d) As provided in subsection (2).
- 5 (e) By completing and filing a donor registry schedule created
- 6 under section 474 of the income tax act of 1967, 1967 PA 281, MCL
- 7 206.474, with the state income tax annual return required under
- 8 part 1 of the income tax act of 1967, 1967 PA 281, MCL 206.1 to
- 9 206.532.
- 10 (2) A donor or other person authorized to make an anatomical
- 11 gift under section 10104 may make a gift by a donor card or other
- 12 record signed by the donor or other person making the gift or by
- 13 authorizing that a statement or symbol indicating that the donor
- 14 has made an anatomical gift be included on a donor registry. If the
- 15 donor or other person is physically unable to sign a record, the
- 16 record may be signed by another individual at the direction of the
- 17 donor or other person and shall meet all of the following
- 18 requirements:
- 19 (a) Be witnessed by at least 2 adults, at least 1 of whom is a
- 20 disinterested witness, who have signed at the request of the donor
- 21 or the other person.
- 22 (b) State that it has been signed and witnessed as provided in
- 23 subdivision (a).
- 24 (3) Revocation, suspension, expiration, or cancellation of a
- 25 driver license or identification card upon which an anatomical gift
- 26 is indicated does not invalidate the gift.
- 27 (4) An anatomical gift made by will takes effect upon the
- 28 donor's death whether or not the will is probated. Invalidation of
- 29 the will after the donor's death does not invalidate the gift.

Sec. 10120. (1) The organ procurement organization may establish or contract for the establishment of a donor registry.

- 2 establish or contract for the establishment of a donor registry. (2) As provided for in section 2 of 1972 PA 222, MCL 28.292, 3 and section 310 of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 4 5 257.310, the secretary of state shall inquire of each applicant, 6 licensee, or state-identification card holder, in person or by 7 mail, whether the individual agrees to participate in a donor 8 registry as described in this part. The secretary of state shall 9 maintain a record of an individual who indicates a willingness to 10 have his or her name placed on the donor registry. The secretary of 11 state shall maintain the donor registry in a manner that provides electronic access, including, but not limited to, the transfer of 12 13 data, to the organ procurement organization or its successor 14 organization, tissue banks, and eye banks. The secretary of state
 - (3) As provided for in section 474 of the income tax act of 1967, 1967 PA 281, MCL 206.474, the department of treasury shall transmit to the secretary of state the donor registry schedule filed by each individual who indicates a willingness to have the individual's name placed on the donor registry described under subsection (2). The department of treasury shall transmit the information described under this subsection in the manner and frequency determined by the department of treasury and the secretary of state. The secretary of state shall maintain a record of each donor registry schedule received from the department of treasury and add that individual to the donor registry described under subsection (2).

shall administer the donor registry in a manner that complies with

subsections (3) and (4) and (5).

(4) (3) A donor registry under this section shall must meet

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- 1 all of the following requirements:
- 2 (a) Be accessible to a procurement organization to allow it to
- 3 obtain the name, address, and date of birth of persons individuals
- 4 on the donor registry to determine, at or near death of the donor
- 5 or a prospective donor, whether the donor or prospective donor has
- 6 made an anatomical gift.
- 7 (b) Provide electronic access, including, but not limited to,
- 8 the transfer of data for purposes of subdivision (a) on a 7-day-a-
- 9 week, 24-hour-a-day basis at no cost to the procurement
- 10 organization.
- 11 (5) (4) Personally identifiable information on a donor
- 12 registry about a donor or prospective donor shall must not be used
- 13 or disclosed without the express consent of the donor, prospective
- 14 donor, or person that made the anatomical gift for any purpose
- 15 other than to determine, at or near death of the donor or
- 16 prospective donor, whether the donor or prospective donor has made,
- 17 amended, or revoked an anatomical gift.
- 18 (6) (5) This section does not prohibit any person from
- 19 creating or maintaining a donor registry that is not established by
- 20 or under contract with this state. A donor registry that is not
- 21 established by or under contract with this state shall do all of
- 22 the following:
- 23 (a) Comply with subsections $\frac{(3)}{(3)}$ and $\frac{(5)}{(3)}$.
- 24 (b) Within 30 days of its establishment, notify the organ
- 25 procurement organization of its establishment.
- 26 (c) Within 30 days of its establishment, give the organ
- 27 procurement organization full access to its records of anatomical
- 28 gifts and amendments to or revocations of anatomical gifts.
