HOUSE BILL NO. 4422

A bill to amend 1985 PA 87, entitled "William Van Regenmorter crime victim's rights act," by amending sections 61 and 61a (MCL 780.811 and 780.811a), section 61 as amended by 2018 PA 370 and section 61a as amended by 2005 PA 184.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 61. (1) Except as otherwise defined in this article, as 2 used in this article:
- 3 (a) "Serious misdemeanor" means 1 or more of the following:

- 10 (iv) (iii)—A violation of section 115 of the Michigan penal code,
- 11 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.115, breaking and entering or illegal entry.
- (v) $\frac{(iv)}{(iv)}$ A violation of section 136b(7) of the Michigan penal
- 13 code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.136b, child abuse in the fourth degree.
- 14 (vi) (v) A violation of section 145 of the Michigan penal code,
- 15 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.145, contributing to the neglect or
- 16 delinquency of a minor.
- (vii) (vii) A misdemeanor violation of section 145d of the
- 18 Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.145d, using the internet
- 19 or a computer to make a prohibited communication.
- 20 (viii) Beginning January 1, 2024, a violation of section 174a(2)
- 21 or (3) (b) of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.174a,
- 22 embezzlement from a vulnerable adult of an amount of less than
- 23 \$200.00.
- 24 (ix) Beginning January 1, 2024, a violation of section
- 25 174a(3)(a) of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.174a,
- 26 embezzlement from a vulnerable adult of an amount of \$200.00 to
- 27 \$1,000.00.
- (x) $\frac{(vii)}{(vii)}$ A violation of section 233 of the Michigan penal code,
- 29 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.233, intentionally aiming a firearm without

- 3 code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.234, discharge of a firearm
- 4 intentionally aimed at a person.

- 6 code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.235, discharge of an intentionally aimed
- 7 firearm resulting in injury.
- 8 (xiii) (x)—A violation of section 335a of the Michigan penal
- 9 code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.335a, indecent exposure.
- 10 (xiv) (xi) A violation of section 411h of the Michigan penal
- 11 code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.411h, stalking.
- 12 (xv) (xii) A violation of section 601b(2) of the Michigan
- 13 vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.601b, injuring a worker in a
- 14 work zone.
- 15 (xvi) Beginning January 1, 2024, a violation of section 601d(1)
- 16 of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.601d, moving
- 17 violation causing death.
- 18 (xvii) Beginning January 1, 2024, a violation of section 601d(2)
- 19 of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.601d, moving
- 20 violation causing serious impairment of a body function.
- 21 (xviii) (xiii) A violation of section 617a of the Michigan vehicle
- 22 code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.617a, leaving the scene of a personal
- 23 injury accident.
- (xix) $\frac{(xix)}{(xix)}$ A violation of section 625 of the Michigan vehicle
- 25 code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.625, operating a vehicle while under the
- 26 influence of or impaired by intoxicating liquor or a controlled
- 27 substance, or with an unlawful blood alcohol content, if the
- 28 violation involves an accident resulting in damage to another
- 29 individual's property or physical injury or death to another

- 1 individual.
- 2 (xx) (xx) Selling or furnishing alcoholic liquor to an
- 3 individual less than 21 years of age in violation of section 701 of
- 4 the Michigan liquor control code of 1998, 1998 PA 58, MCL 436.1701,
- 5 if the violation results in physical injury or death to any
- 6 individual.
- 7 (xxi) (xvi) A violation of section 80176(1) or (3) of the
- 8 natural resources and environmental protection act, 1994 PA 451,
- 9 MCL 324.80176, operating a vessel while under the influence of or
- 10 impaired by intoxicating liquor or a controlled substance, or with
- 11 an unlawful blood alcohol content, if the violation involves an
- 12 accident resulting in damage to another individual's property or
- 13 physical injury or death to any individual.
- 14 (xxii) (xxii)—A violation of a local ordinance substantially
- 15 corresponding to a violation enumerated in subparagraphs (i) to
- 16 $\frac{(xvi)}{\cdot}(xxi)$.
- 17 (xxiii) (xviii) A violation charged as a crime or serious
- 18 misdemeanor enumerated in subparagraphs (i) to (xxii) (xxii) but
- 19 subsequently reduced to or pleaded to as a misdemeanor. As used in
- 20 this subparagraph, "crime" means that term as defined in section 2.
- 22 described in section 2 of 1976 PA 223, MCL 18.352.
- 23 (c) "Defendant" means a person charged with or convicted of
- 24 having committed a serious misdemeanor against a victim.
- 25 (d) "Final disposition" means the ultimate termination of the
- 26 criminal prosecution of a defendant including, but not limited to,
- 27 dismissal, acquittal, or imposition of a sentence by the court.
- 28 (e) "Person" means an individual, organization, partnership,
- 29 corporation, or governmental entity.

- (f) "Prisoner" means a person an individual who has been
 convicted and sentenced to imprisonment for having committed a
 serious misdemeanor against a victim.
- 4 (g) "Prosecuting attorney" means the prosecuting attorney for
- 5 a county, an assistant prosecuting attorney for a county, the
- 6 attorney general, the deputy attorney general, an assistant
- 7 attorney general, a special prosecuting attorney, or, in connection
- 8 with the prosecution of an ordinance violation, an attorney for the
- 9 political subdivision that enacted the ordinance upon which the
- 10 violation is based.
- 11 (h) "Victim" means any of the following:
- 12 (i) An individual who suffers direct or threatened physical,
- 13 financial, or emotional harm as a result of the commission of a
- 14 serious misdemeanor, except as provided in subparagraph (ii), (iii),
- 15 (iv), or (v).
- (ii) The following individuals other than the defendant if the
- 17 victim is deceased, except as provided in subparagraph (v):
- 18 (A) The spouse of the deceased victim.
- 19 (B) A child of the deceased victim if the child is 18 years of
- 20 age or older and sub-subparagraph (A) does not apply.
- 21 (C) A parent of a deceased victim if sub-subparagraphs (A) and
- 22 (B) do not apply.
- 23 (D) The guardian or custodian of a child of a deceased victim
- 24 if the child is less than 18 years of age and sub-subparagraphs (A)
- 25 to (C) do not apply.
- **26** (E) A sibling of the deceased victim if sub-subparagraphs (A)
- 27 to (D) do not apply.
- 28 (F) A grandparent of the deceased victim if sub-subparagraphs
- (A) to (E) do not apply.

- $oldsymbol{1}$ (iii) A parent, guardian, or custodian of a victim who is less
- 2 than 18 years of age and who is neither the defendant nor
- 3 incarcerated, if the parent, guardian, or custodian so chooses.
- 4 (iv) A parent, guardian, or custodian of a victim who is so
- 5 mentally incapacitated that he or she cannot meaningfully
- 6 understand or participate in the legal process if he or she is not
- 7 the defendant and is not incarcerated.
- $\mathbf{8}$ (v) For the purpose of submitting or making an impact
- 9 statement only, if the victim as defined in subparagraph (i) is
- 10 deceased, is so mentally incapacitated that he or she cannot
- 11 meaningfully understand or participate in the legal process, or
- 12 consents to the designation as a victim of the following
- 13 individuals other than the defendant:
- 14 (A) The spouse of the victim.
- 15 (B) A child of the victim if the child is 18 years of age or
- 16 older.
- 17 (C) A parent of the victim.
- 18 (D) The guardian or custodian of a child of the victim if the
- 19 child is less than 18 years of age.
- 20 (E) A sibling of the victim.
- 21 (F) A grandparent of the victim.
- 22 (G) A guardian or custodian of the victim if the victim is
- 23 less than 18 years of age at the time of the commission of the
- 24 crime and that quardian or custodian is not incarcerated.
- 25 (2) If a victim as defined in subsection (1) (h) (i) is
- 26 physically or emotionally unable to exercise the privileges and
- 27 rights under this article, the victim may designate his or her
- 28 spouse, child 18 years of age or older, parent, sibling, or
- 29 grandparent or any other person 18 years of age or older who is

1 neither the defendant nor incarcerated to act in his or her place

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- 2 while the physical or emotional disability continues. The victim
- 3 shall provide the prosecuting attorney with the name of the person
- 4 who is to act in place of the victim. During the physical or
- 5 emotional disability, notices to be provided under this article to
- 6 the victim must continue to be sent only to the victim.
- 7 (3) An individual who is charged with a serious misdemeanor, a
- 8 crime as defined in section 2, or an offense as defined in section
- 9 31 arising out of the same transaction from which the charge
- 10 against the defendant arose is not eligible to exercise the
- 11 privileges and rights established for victims under this article.
- 12 (4) An individual who is incarcerated is not eligible to
- 13 exercise the privileges and rights established for victims under
- 14 this article except that he or she may submit a written statement
- 15 to the court for consideration at sentencing.
- Sec. 61a. A law enforcement officer or prosecuting attorney
- 17 who files with the court a complaint, appearance ticket, traffic
- 18 citation, or other charging instrument regarding a serious
- 19 misdemeanor described in section 61(1)(a)(xv), (xvi), or (xvii),
- 20 61(1)(a)(xix), (xx), or (xxi), or a local ordinance substantially
- 21 corresponding to a serious misdemeanor described in section
- 22 $\frac{61(1)(a)(xv)}{(xvi)}$, or (xvi), or (xvi), 61(1)(a)(xix), (xx), or (xxi), shall
- 23 place a statement on the complaint, appearance ticket, traffic
- 24 citation, or other charging instrument that the offense resulted in
- 25 damage to another individual's property or physical injury or death
- 26 to another individual.
