THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 5. (1) By a properly executed power of attorney, a parent or guardian of a minor child may temporarily delegate to another person his or her powers regarding care, custody, or property of the minor child under this act. This temporary delegation of power may be for up to 180 days, except that if a parent or guardian is

serving in the United States Armed Forces and is deployed to a

- 1 foreign nation, a power of attorney may be effective until the
- 2 thirty-first day after the end of the deployment. A person to whom
- 3 the parent or guardian delegates these powers is required to have
- 4 undergone the criminal history records check, home safety
- 5 assessment and inspection, and training required under this act. A
- 6 parent or quardian cannot delegate, under this act, his or her
- 7 power to consent to marriage or adoption of the minor child,
- 8 consent to an abortion or inducement of an abortion to be performed
- 9 on or for the minor child, or to terminate parental rights to the
- 10 minor child. A parent is not authorized to consent to the marriage
- 11 of a child who is under the legal age of marriage.
- 12 (2) The parent or guardian executing a power of attorney may
- 13 revoke or withdraw the power of attorney at any time.
