SENATE BILL NO. 396

June 15, 2023, Introduced by Senator MCDONALD RIVET and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 1937 (Ex Sess) PA 4, entitled

"An act relative to continuing tenure of office of certificated teachers in public educational institutions; to provide for probationary periods; to regulate discharges or demotions; to provide for resignations and leaves of absence; to create a state tenure commission and to prescribe the powers and duties thereof; and to prescribe penalties for violation of the provisions of this act,"

by amending section 4 of article I, sections 2a and 3b of article II, and section 3 of article III (MCL 38.74, 38.82a, 38.83b, and 38.93), section 4 of article I as amended by 2011 PA 100 and sections 2a and 3b of article II as added and section 3 of article

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 ARTICLE T 2 Sec. 4. The word "demote" means to suspend without pay for 15 3 or more consecutive days or reduce compensation for a particular 4 school year by more than an amount equivalent to 30 days' compensation or to transfer to a position carrying a lower salary. 5 However, demote does not include discontinuance of salary pursuant 6 to under section 3 of article IV , the discontinuance or reduction 7 of performance-based compensation paid pursuant to section 1250 of 8 9 the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1250, or a reduction in personnel, including, but not limited to, a reduction in 10 11 workweeks or workdays. 12 ARTICLE II 13 Sec. 2a. A probationary teacher who is rated as effective or 14 highly effective on his or her the probationary teacher's most recent annual year-end performance evaluation under section 1249 of 15 the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1249, is not subject 16 17 to being displaced displacement by a teacher on continuing tenure 18 solely because the other teacher has continuing tenure. 19 Sec. 3b. (1) Except Before July 1, 2024, and except as otherwise provided in subsection (2), a teacher shall is not be 20 21 considered to have successfully completed the probationary period 22 unless the teacher has been rated as effective or highly effective 23 on his or her the teacher's 3 most recent annual year-end performance evaluations under section 1249 of the revised school 24 25 code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1249, and has completed at least 5 full 26 school years of employment in a probationary period. 27 (2) If Before July 1, 2024, if a teacher has been rated as

Sec. 3. The controlling board of the school district employing a teacher on continuing tenure shall ensure that the teacher is provided with an annual a year-end performance evaluation in accordance with section 1249 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1249. If the teacher has received a needing-support rating of ineffective or minimally effective on an annual a yearend performance evaluation, the school district shall provide the teacher with an individualized development plan developed by appropriate administrative personnel in consultation with the individual teacher. The individualized development plan shall must require the teacher to make progress toward individual development goals within a specified time period, not to exceed 180 days. The annual year-end performance evaluation shall must be based on multiple classroom observations conducted during the period covered by the evaluation and shall must include, in addition to the factors required under section 1249 of the revised school code,
