SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 825

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending sections 2701, 2705, 2709, and 2723 (MCL 333.2701, 333.2705, 333.2709, and 333.2723), section 2701 as amended by 2022 PA 38, section 2705 as amended by 2022 PA 37, section 2709 as added by 1990 PA 16, and section 2723 as amended by 2014 PA 173.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2701. As used in this part:
- 2 (a) "Board certified" means certified to practice in a
- 3 particular medical specialty by a national board recognized by the
- 4 American Board of Medical Specialties or the American Osteopathic
- 5 Association.
- 6 (b) "Certified nurse midwife" means an individual who is

- 1 licensed as a registered professional nurse under part 172 who has
- 2 been granted a specialty certification in the practice of nurse
- 3 midwifery by the Michigan board of nursing under section 17210.
- 4 (c) "Certified nurse practitioner" means an individual who is
- 5 licensed as a registered professional nurse under part 172 who has
- 6 been granted a specialty certification as a nurse practitioner by
- 7 the Michigan board of nursing under section 17210.
- 8 (d) "Clinical nurse specialist-certified" means an individual
- 9 who is licensed as a registered professional nurse under part 172
- 10 who has been granted a specialty certification as a clinical nurse
- 11 specialist by the Michigan board of nursing under section 17210.
- 12 (e) "Dental school" means an accredited program for the
- 13 training of individuals to become dentists.
- 14 (f) "Dentist" means an individual who is licensed to engage in
- 15 the practice of dentistry under part 166.
- 16 (g) "Designated advanced practice registered nurse" means a
- 17 certified nurse midwife, certified nurse practitioner, or clinical
- 18 nurse specialist-certified.
- (h) "Designated mental health professional" means an
- 20 individual who is qualified in the area of mental illness or
- 21 developmental disabilities and who is 1 of the following:
- (i) A nurse.
- 23 (ii) A psychologist.
- 24 (iii) A licensed master's social worker.
- 25 (iv) A licensed professional counselor.
- (v) A marriage and family therapist.
- 27 (i) "Designated physician" means a physician qualified in 1 of
- 28 the physician specialty areas identified in section 2711.
- 29 (j) "Designated professional" means a designated physician,

- 1 designated advanced practice registered nurse, dentist, physician's
- 2 assistant, or designated mental health professional, or midwife.
- 3 (k) "Health resource shortage area" means a geographic area,
- 4 population group, or health facility designated by the department
- 5 under section 2717.
- (l) "Licensed master's social worker" means an individual who
- 7 is licensed under part 185 to engage in the practice of social work
- 8 at the master's level.
- 9 (m) "Licensed professional counselor" means an individual who
- 10 is licensed under part 181 to engage in the practice of counseling
- 11 without supervision.
- 12 (n) "Marriage and family therapist" means an individual who is
- 13 licensed under part 169 to engage in the practice of marriage and
- 14 family therapy.
- (o) "Medicaid" means benefits under the program of medical
- 16 assistance established under title XIX of the social security act,
- 17 42 USC 1396 to $\frac{1396w-6}{}$, 1396w-8, and administered by the department
- 18 under the social welfare act, 1939 PA 280, MCL 400.1 to 400.119b.
- 19 (p) "Medical school" means an accredited program for the
- 20 training of individuals to become physicians.
- 21 (q) "Medicare" means benefits under the federal Medicare
- 22 program established under title XVIII of the social security act,
- 23 42 USC 1395 to 1395*lll*.
- 24 (r) "Mental health professional program" means an accredited
- 25 program for the training of individuals to become a designated
- 26 mental health professional.
- 27 (s) "Midwife" means an individual who is licensed under part
- 28 171 to engage in the practice of midwifery.
- (t) "Midwifery program" means an accredited program for the

training of individuals to become midwives.

- 2 (u) (s) "National Health Service Corps" means the agency
 3 established under 42 USC 254d.
- 4 (v) (t) "Nurse" means an individual who is licensed to engage
 5 in the practice of nursing under part 172.
- (w) (u) "Nursing program" means an accredited program for the
 training of individuals to become nurses.
- 8 (x) (v)—"Physician" means an individual who is licensed as a physician under part 170 or part 175.
- 10 (y) (w)—"Physician's assistant" means an individual who is 11 licensed as a physician's assistant under part 170 or part 175.
- 12 (z) (x) "Physician's assistant program" means an accredited
 13 program for the training of individuals to become physician's
 14 assistants.
- 15 (aa) (y) "Psychologist" means an individual licensed to engage 16 in the practice of psychology under part 182.
- (bb) (z)—"Service obligation" means the contractual obligation undertaken by an individual under section 2705 or section 2707 to provide health care services for a determinable time period at a site designated by the department.
- 21 Sec. 2705. (1) The department shall administer an essential 22 health provider repayment program for designated professionals who
- 23 have incurred a debt or expenses as a result of a loan taken to
- 24 attend a medical school, dental school, mental health professional
- 25 program, nursing program for the training of certified nurse
- 26 midwives, certified nurse practitioners, or clinical nurse
- 27 specialists-certified, or midwifery program, or physician's
- 28 assistant program or as a result of providing services in a health
- 29 resource shortage area. The department may each year repay all or

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- 1 part of a designated professional's debt or expenses, but the
- 2 amount repaid in any 1 year shall must not exceed the amount
- 3 described in subsection (3). The department shall repay a debt or
- 4 expenses only for a designated professional who has entered into a
- 5 written contract with the department that requires the designated
- 6 professional to engage in the full-time practice of health care
- 7 services in a health resource shortage area to which he or she the
- 8 designated professional is assigned by the department for a period
- 9 equal in years to the number of years for which the department has
- 10 agreed in the contract to make a debt or expense repayment, or for
- 11 a period of 2 years, whichever is greater.
- 12 (2) A debt or expense repayment on behalf of a designated
- 13 professional under subsection (1) for fulfilling a service
- 14 obligation for a particular year must be paid in a lump sum at the
- 15 completion of the service obligation for that year. A designated
- 16 professional who does not fulfill a service obligation for a
- 17 particular year forfeits his or her the right to the debt or
- 18 expense repayment or any part of it for that year and the
- 19 department may treat an agreement for further debt or expense
- 20 repayment in a subsequent year as void. In its sole discretion, the
- 21 department may make a debt or expense repayment before or during
- 22 each year of service if there are extenuating circumstances. In its
- 23 sole discretion, the department may pay a pro rata amount of an
- 24 agreed debt or expense repayment to a designated professional or
- 25 his or her the designated professional's estate if 1 of the
- 26 following occurs before the completion of the designated
- 27 professional's service obligation:
- (a) The designated professional dies.
- 29 (b) The designated professional is unable, by reason of

- 1 permanent disability, to render the service.
- (c) Other circumstances prevail that are considered by thedepartment to constitute a compelling reason to consider the
- 4 service obligation fulfilled.
- 5 (3) In any year of a debt or expense repayment program, the
- 6 maximum amount of a debt or expense repayment is \$40,000.00 per
- 7 year. The maximum amount of debt or expense repayment the
- 8 department may pay on behalf of a designated professional is
- 9 \$300,000.00, paid over a period of 10 years or more. The written
- 10 contract described in subsection (1) must include the amount the
- 11 department shall pay on behalf of a designated professional and the
- 12 amount payable for each year of service.
- 13 (4) The department may accept funds from any source for the
- 14 operation of the essential health provider repayment program, and
- 15 the department shall distribute those funds in a manner consistent
- 16 with this section.
- 17 (5) The department shall give the essential health provider
- 18 repayment program created by this section priority over the other
- 19 programs created under this part.
- 20 Sec. 2709. The department may cooperate with a certified nurse
- 21 midwifery service to To support the placement of certified nurse
- 22 midwives or midwives in health resource shortage areas, the
- 23 department may cooperate with any of the following:
 - (a) A certified nurse midwifery service.
- 25 (b) An association representing midwives or certified nurse
- 26 midwives from this state.
- 27 (c) An association representing midwives and certified nurse
- 28 midwives from this state, who attend births in homes and in
- 29 freestanding birth centers licensed under article 17.

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- Sec. 2723. (1) The department may promulgate rules necessary for the implementation of the department's functions under this part.
- 4 (2) The department shall report biennially to the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on the department of community health and human services, the house and senate fiscal agencies, the governor, the state health planning council, and the public health advisory council on the status of the Michigan essential health provider recruitment strategy for the preceding 2 years. In addition to the status report, the report shall must include, but
- 12 (a) Review of state and federal legislation, rules,
 13 guidelines, and policy directives affecting the health personnel of
 14 health resource shortage areas.

not be limited to, all of the following:

- (b) Recommendations concerning physician specialty areas or other health professions for inclusion in the Michigan essential health provider recruitment strategy based upon a determination of the need for various types of health care providers in this state.
- (c) An assessment of whether the amount of debt or expense repayment an individual may receive under section 2705(3) is sufficient to facilitate the placement and retention of designated professionals in health resource shortage areas, or whether that maximum amount should be adjusted to reflect changes in tuition costs for students enrolled in medical schools, dental schools, nursing programs, or physician's assistant programs, or midwifery programs.
- 27 (d) An analysis of the return on investment and effectiveness 28 of the grant program under section 2707 and the essential health 29 provider repayment program under section 2705.

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
