SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 1168

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending sections 16335, 17801, and 17821 (MCL 333.16335, 333.17801, and 333.17821), as amended by 2009 PA 55, and by adding sections 17820a and 17820b.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 16335. (1) Fees for a person an individual licensed or seeking licensure to engage in the practice of physical therapy or practice as a physical therapist assistant under part 178 are as follows:
- 5 (a) Application processing fee \$ 20.00
- 6 (b) Examination fees:

(2) The fee for an individual seeking to hold a compact privilege under the physical therapy licensure compact enacted in section 16187 is \$90.00 per year.

Sec. 17801. (1) As used in this part:

- (a) "Physical therapist" means an individual **who is** licensed under this article **or authorized under section 17820a** to engage in the practice of physical therapy.
- (b) "Physical therapist assistant" means an individual with a health profession subfield license under this part, or who is authorized under section 17820b to engage in practice as a physical therapist assistant, who assists a physical therapist in physical therapy intervention.
- (c) "Physical therapy licensure compact" means the physical therapy licensure compact as enacted in section 16187.
- (d) (e) "Practice as physical therapist assistant" means the practice of physical therapy performed under the supervision of a physical therapist licensed under this part.
- (e) (d)—"Practice of physical therapy" means the evaluation of, education of, consultation with, or treatment of an individual by the employment of effective properties of physical measures and the use of therapeutic exercises and rehabilitative procedures, with or without assistive devices, for the purpose of preventing, correcting, or alleviating a physical or mental disability. Physical therapy includes treatment planning, performance of tests and measurements, interpretation of referrals, initiation of

referrals, instruction, consultative services, and supervision of

- 1 personnel. Physical measures include massage, mobilization, heat,
- 2 cold, air, light, water, electricity, and sound. Practice of
- 3 physical therapy does not include the identification of underlying
- 4 medical problems or etiologies, establishment of medical diagnoses,
- 5 or the prescribing of treatment.
- 6 (2) In addition to the definitions in this part, article 1
- 7 contains general definitions and principles of construction
- 8 applicable to all articles in this code and part 161 contains
- **9** definitions applicable to this part.
- 10 Sec. 17820a. (1) An individual who holds a compact privilege
- 11 to practice as a physical therapist under the physical therapy
- 12 licensure compact is authorized to engage in the practice of
- 13 physical therapy under this article.
- 14 (2) For purposes of this article, including the obligations of
- 15 an individual who is licensed as a physical therapist, an
- 16 individual who holds a compact privilege to practice as a physical
- 17 therapist under the physical therapy licensure compact is
- 18 considered a physical therapist who is licensed under this part.
- 19 Sec. 17820b. (1) An individual who holds a compact privilege
- 20 to work as a physical therapist assistant under the physical
- 21 therapy licensure compact is authorized to engage in practice as a
- 22 physical therapist assistant under this article under the
- 23 supervision of a physical therapist.
- 24 (2) For purposes of this article, including the obligations of
- 25 an individual who is licensed as a physical therapist assistant, an
- 26 individual who holds a compact privilege to work as a physical
- 27 therapist assistant under the physical therapy licensure compact is
- 28 considered a physical therapist assistant who is licensed under
- 29 this part.

Sec. 17821. (1) The Michigan board of physical therapy is
created in the department and shall consist of the following 11
voting members who $\frac{\text{shall-must}}{\text{must}}$ meet the requirements of part 161: 6
physical therapists, 1 physical therapist assistant, and 4 public
members

- (2) The terms of office of the individual members of the board created under this section, except those appointed to fill vacancies, expire 4 years after appointment on December 31 of the year in which the term expires.
- (3) The board shall select the director or the director's designee to act as this state's delegate for purposes of the physical therapy licensure compact.

13 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 1 year 14 after the date it is enacted into law.

15 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect 16 unless House Bill No. 4504 of the 102nd Legislature is enacted into 17 law.

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
