A bill to create the Michigan high-speed internet office; to prescribe the powers and duties of the Michigan high-speed internet office; to allow the provision of grants and other financial and technical assistance related to broadband and digital infrastructure; and to provide the powers and duties of certain state officers and entities.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act may be cited as the "Michigan high-speed internet office act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:

- (a) "Broadband service" means a service, not including a
 satellite service, capable of delivering high-speed internet access
 that meets all of the following:
 - (i) Provides symmetrical upload and download speeds.

- 9 (b) "Broadband service provider" means an entity that provides10 broadband service in this state.

- (d) "Director" means the director of the Michigan high-speedinternet office.
- (e) "Modern broadband and digital infrastructure" means thetechnology and associated equipment used to provide broadbandservice.
- 18 (f) "Office" means the Michigan high-speed internet office
 19 created in section 3.
- Sec. 3. (1) The Michigan high-speed internet office is created within the department.
- (2) The governor shall appoint a director of the Michigan
 high-speed internet office. The individual appointed as the
 director must be qualified by training and experience to perform
 the duties and exercise the powers of the office and the director.
- Sec. 5. The director shall establish procedures for the office for budgeting, expending money, and employing personnel according to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to

Sec. 7. The office may, upon appropriation, award grants or
 provide other financial and technical assistance to carry out the
 purposes of this act.

Sec. 9. The office shall do all of the following:

- (a) Implement modern broadband and digital infrastructure
 duties assigned to the office and coordinate with other state
 departments responsible for modern broadband and digital
 infrastructure matters.
 - (b) Facilitate collaboration among public and private entities to encourage partnerships, regional coordination, and streamlined policies to increase modern broadband and digital infrastructure.
- 12 (c) Identify best practices and external resources to support

- (d) Provide capacity building and digital literacy resourcesto the public and entities seeking to expand broadband service andadoption.
- (e) Promote and implement policies that utilize modernbroadband and digital infrastructure to do any of the following:

- (iii) Increase hiring and retention of skilled workers thatsupport modern broadband and digital infrastructure in this state.

- (f) Collect and analyze data to accurately determine the availability of broadband service, including the development of methods that accurately identify parcel level wholesale and retail broadband infrastructure availability and adoption throughout this
