## **HOUSE BILL NO. 4354**

April 11, 2023, Introduced by Reps. Weiss, Brenda Carter, Tsernoglou, Hood, O'Neal, Rheingans, Young, Morse, Brabec and Aiyash and referred to the Committee on Labor.

A bill to amend 1947 PA 336, entitled

"An act to prohibit strikes by certain public employees; to provide review from disciplinary action with respect thereto; to provide for the mediation of grievances and the holding of elections; to declare and protect the rights and privileges of public employees; to require certain provisions in collective bargaining agreements; to prescribe means of enforcement and penalties for the violation of the provisions of this act; and to make appropriations,"

by amending section 15 (MCL 423.215), as amended by 2014 PA 414.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 15. (1) A public employer shall bargain collectively with 1 2 the representatives of its employees as described in section 11 and 3 may make and enter into collective bargaining agreements with those 4 representatives. Except as otherwise provided in this section, for 5 the purposes of this section, to bargain collectively is to perform 6 the mutual obligation of the employer and the representative of the 7 employees to meet at reasonable times and confer in good faith with 8 respect to wages, hours, and other terms and conditions of 9 employment, or to negotiate an agreement, or any question arising under the agreement, and to execute a written contract, ordinance, 10 11 or resolution incorporating any agreement reached if requested by 12 either party, but this obligation does not compel either party to 13 agree to a proposal or make a concession.
- 14 (2) A public school employer has the responsibility,
  15 authority, and right to shall manage and direct on behalf of the
  16 public the operations and activities of the public schools under
  17 its control.

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- 18 (3) Collective bargaining between a public school employer and 19 a bargaining representative of its employees shall must not include 20 any of the following subjects:
  - (a) Who is or will be the policyholder of an employee group insurance benefit. This subdivision does not affect the duty to bargain with respect to types and levels of benefits and coverages for employee group insurance. A change or proposed change in a type or to a level of benefit, policy specification, or coverage for employee group insurance shall must be bargained by the public school employer and the bargaining representative before the change

1 may take takes effect.

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- 2 (b) Establishment of the starting day for the school year and 3 of the amount of pupil contact time required to receive full state 4 school aid under section 1284 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1284, and under section 101 of the state school aid 6 act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1701.
- 7 (c) The composition of school improvement committees
  8 established under section 1277 of the revised school code, 1976 PA
  9 451, MCL 380.1277.
- (d) The decision of whether or not to provide or allow interdistrict or intradistrict open enrollment opportunity in a school district or the selection of grade levels or schools in which to allow an open enrollment opportunity.
- 14 (e) The decision of whether or not to act as an authorizing 15 body to grant a contract to organize and operate 1 or more public 16 school academies under the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 17 380.1 to 380.1852.
- (f) The decision of whether or not to contract with a third 18 19 party for 1 or more noninstructional support services; or the 20 procedures for obtaining the contract for noninstructional support services other than bidding described in this subdivision; or the 21 22 identity of the third party; or the impact of the contract for 23 noninstructional support services on individual employees or the bargaining unit. However, this subdivision applies only if the 24 25 bargaining unit that is providing the noninstructional support services is given an opportunity to bid on the contract for the 26 27 noninstructional support services on an equal basis as other 28 bidders.
  - (g) The use of volunteers in providing services at its

1 schools.

- 2 (h) Decisions concerning use and staffing of experimental or 3 pilot programs and decisions concerning use of technology to 4 deliver educational programs and services and staffing to provide 5 that technology, or the impact of those decisions on individual 6 employees or the bargaining unit.
  - (i) Any compensation or additional work assignment intended to reimburse an employee for or allow an employee to recover any monetary penalty imposed under this act.
  - (j) Any decision made by the public school employer regarding teacher placement, or the impact of that decision on an individual employee or the bargaining unit.
  - (k) Decisions about the development, content, standards, procedures, adoption, and implementation of the public school employer's policies regarding personnel decisions when conducting a staffing or program reduction or any other personnel determination resulting in the elimination of a position, when conducting a recall from a staffing or program reduction or any other personnel determination resulting in the elimination of a position, or in hiring after a staffing or program reduction or any other personnel determination resulting in the elimination of a position, as provided under section 1248 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1248, any decision made by the public school employer pursuant to those policies, or the impact of those decisions on an individual employee or the bargaining unit.
  - (1) Decisions about the development, content, standards, procedures, adoption, and implementation of a public school employer's performance evaluation system adopted under section 1249 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1249, or under

1937 (Ex Sess) PA 4, MCL 38.71 to 38.191, decisions concerning the 1 2 content of a performance evaluation of an employee under those provisions of law, or the impact of those decisions on an 3 individual employee or the bargaining unit. 4 5 (m) For public employees whose employment is regulated by 1937 (Ex Sess) PA 4, MCL 38.71 to 38.191, decisions about the 6 7 development, content, standards, procedures, adoption, and 8 implementation of a policy regarding discharge or discipline of an 9 employee, decisions concerning the discharge or discipline of an 10 individual employee, or the impact of those decisions on an 11 individual employee or the bargaining unit. For public employees 12 whose employment is regulated by 1937 (Ex Sess) PA 4, MCL 38.71 to 38.191, a public school employer shall not adopt, implement, or 13 14 maintain a policy for discharge or discipline of an employee that 15 includes a standard for discharge or discipline that is different 16 than the arbitrary and capricious standard provided under section 1 17 of article IV of 1937 (Ex Sess) PA 4, MCL 38.101. 18 (n) Decisions about the format, timing, or number of classroom 19 observations conducted for the purposes of section 3a of article II 20 of 1937 (Ex Sess) PA 4, MCL 38.83a, decisions concerning the 21 classroom observation of an individual employee, or the impact of 22 those decisions on an individual employee or the bargaining unit. 23 (o) Decisions about the development, content, standards, procedures, adoption, and implementation of the method of 24 25 compensation required under section 1250 of the revised school 26 code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1250, decisions about how an employee 27 performance evaluation is used to determine performance-based compensation under section 1250 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 28 29 451, MCL 380.1250, decisions concerning the performance-based

compensation of an individual employee, or the impact of those 1 2 decisions on an individual employee or the bargaining unit.

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- (p) Decisions about the development, format, content, and 3 procedures of the notification to parents and legal quardians required under section 1249a of the revised school code, 1976 PA 5 451, MCL 380.1249a. 6
  - (i)  $\frac{(q)}{q}$  Any requirement that would violate section 10(3).
  - (4) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (3)(f), the matters described in subsection (3) are prohibited subjects of bargaining between a public school employer and a bargaining representative of its employees, and, for the purposes of this act, are within the sole authority of the public school employer to decide.
- 14 (5) If a public school is placed in the state school 15 reform/redesign school district or is placed under a chief 16 executive officer under former section 1280c of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1280c, then, for the purposes of 17 18 collective bargaining under this act, the state school 19 reform/redesign officer or the chief executive officer, as 20 applicable, is the public school employer of the public school employees of that public school for as long as the public school is 21 part of the state school reform/redesign school district or 22 23 operated by the chief executive officer.
  - (6) A public school employer's collective bargaining duty under this act and a collective bargaining agreement entered into by a public school employer under this act are subject to all of the following:
- (a) Any effect on collective bargaining and any modification 28 29 of a collective bargaining agreement occurring under former section

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- 1 1280c of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451. , MCL 380.1280c.
- 2 (b) For a public school in which the superintendent of public
- 3 instruction implements 1 of the 4 school intervention models
- 4 described in former section 1280c of the revised school code, 1976
- 5 PA 451, MCL 380.1280c, if the school intervention model that is
- 6 implemented affects collective bargaining or requires modification
- 7 of a collective bargaining agreement, any effect on collective
- 8 bargaining and any modification of a collective bargaining
- 9 agreement under that school intervention model.
- 10 (7) Each collective bargaining agreement entered into between
- 11 a public employer and public employees under this act on or after
- 12 March 28, 2013 shall must include a provision that allows an
- 13 emergency manager appointed under the local financial stability and
- 14 choice act, 2012 PA 436, MCL 141.1541 to 141.1575, to reject,
- 15 modify, or terminate the collective bargaining agreement as
- 16 provided in the local financial stability and choice act, 2012 PA
- **17** 436, MCL 141.1541 to 141.1575. Provisions required by this
- 18 subsection are prohibited subjects of bargaining under this act.
- 19 (8) Collective bargaining agreements under this act may be
- 20 rejected, modified, or terminated pursuant to the local financial
- 21 stability and choice act, 2012 PA 436, MCL 141.1541 to 141.1575.
- 22 This act does not confer a right to bargain that would infringe on
- 23 the exercise of powers under the local financial stability and
- 24 choice act, 2012 PA 436, MCL 141.1541 to 141.1575.
- 25 (9) A unit of local government that enters into a consent
- 26 agreement under the local financial stability and choice act, 2012
- 27 PA 436, MCL 141.1541 to 141.1575, is not subject to subsection (1)
- 28 for the term of the consent agreement, as provided in the local
- 29 financial stability and choice act, 2012 PA 436, MCL 141.1541 to

- **1** 141.1575.
- 2 (10) If the charter of a city, village, or township with a
- 3 population of 500,000 or more requires and specifies the method of

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- 4 selection of a retirant member of the municipality's fire
- 5 department, police department, or fire and police department
- 6 pension or retirement board, the inclusion of the retirant member
- 7 on the board and the method of selection of that retirant member
- 8 are prohibited subjects of collective bargaining, and any provision
- ${f 9}$  in a collective bargaining agreement that purports to modify that
- 10 charter requirement is void and of no effect.
- 11 (11) The following are prohibited subjects of bargaining and
- 12 are at the sole discretion of the public employer:
- (a) A decision as to whether or not the public employer will
- 14 enter into an intergovernmental agreement to consolidate 1 or more
- 15 functions or services, to jointly perform 1 or more functions or
- 16  $\frac{\text{services, or to otherwise collaborate regarding 1 or more functions}}{\text{services, or to otherwise collaborate regarding 1 or more functions}}$
- 17 or services.
- 18 (b) The procedures for obtaining a contract for the transfer
- 19 of functions or responsibilities under an agreement described in
- 20 subdivision (a).
- 21 (c) The identities of any other parties to an agreement
- 22 described in subdivision (a).
- 23 (12) Subsection (11) does not relieve a public employer of any
- 24 duty established by law to collectively bargain with its employees
- 25 as to the effect of a contract described in subsection (11) (a) on
- 26 its employees.
- 27 (11) (13) An agreement with a collective bargaining unit shall
- 28 must not require a public employer to pay the costs of an
- 29 independent examiner verification described in section 10(9).
