HOUSE BILL NO. 4838

June 22, 2023, Introduced by Reps. Tsernoglou, McFall, Andrews, Hope, Pohutsky, Wilson, Price, Weiss, Martus, Hill, Rheingans, Conlin, McKinney, Young, Fitzgerald, MacDonell, Paiz, Brabec, Mentzer, Steckloff, Coffia, Byrnes, Hood, Dievendorf, Neeley, Scott, O'Neal, Brenda Carter, Wegela, Tyrone Carter, Farhat and Aiyash and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1969 PA 287, entitled

"An act to regulate pet shops, animal control shelters, and animal protection shelters; to establish uniform procedures and minimum requirements for adoption of dogs, cats, and ferrets; and to prescribe penalties and civil fines and to provide remedies,"

by amending sections 1, 5a, and 10 (MCL 287.331, 287.335a, and 287.340), section 1 as amended by 2017 PA 84 and section 5a as amended by 2016 PA 392.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 1. As used in this act:

(a) "Adoption" means a transfer of ownership, with or without

- 1 remuneration, of an animal from an animal control shelter or animal
- 2 protection shelter to an individual for the purpose of being a
- 3 companion animal for that individual. As used in this subdivision,
- 4 a companion animal includes, but is not limited to, a dog that is
- 5 used for hunting or as a guard dog.
- 6 (b) "Alteration" means a professional sterilization procedure
- 7 performed by a veterinarian that renders a dog, cat, or ferret
- 8 incapable of reproducing.
- 9 (c) "Altered", in reference to a dog, cat, or ferret, means
- 10 having undergone alteration.
- 11 (d) Except as provided in section 8b, "animal" means a mammal,
- 12 except livestock as that term is defined in 1937 PA 284, MCL
- 13 287.121 to MCL 287.131, and rodents.
- 14 (e) "Animal abuse offense" means 1 or more of the following,
- 15 but does not include the lawful use of an animal to hunt or to
- 16 participate in field trials or the lawful killing or other use of
- 17 an animal in farming or a generally accepted animal husbandry or
- 18 farming practice involving livestock:
- 19 (i) A violation of section 49 of the Michigan penal code, 1931
- **20** PA 328, MCL 750.49.
- 21 (ii) A violation of section 50 of the Michigan penal code, 1931
- 22 PA 328, MCL 750.50.
- 23 (iii) A violation of section 50a of the Michigan penal code,
- 24 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.50a.
- (iv) A violation of section 50b of the Michigan penal code,
- 26 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.50b.
- (v) A violation of section 50c of the Michigan penal code,
- 28 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.50c.
- (vi) A violation of section 158 of the Michigan penal code,

- 1 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.158, if the violation arose out of a crime
- 2 against nature with an animal.
- (vii) A violation of a local ordinance **that** substantially
- 4 corresponding corresponds to a violation described in subparagraphs
- 5 (i) to (vi).
- 6 (viii) An attempt or conspiracy to commit an offense described
- 7 in subparagraphs (i) to (vii).
- 8 (f) "Animal control shelter" means a facility operated by a
- 9 municipality for the impoundment and care of animals that are found
- 10 in the streets or at large, animals that are otherwise held due to
- 11 the violation of a municipal ordinance or state law, or animals
- 12 that are surrendered to the animal control shelter.
- 13 (g) "Animal protection shelter" means a not-for-profit
- 14 facility operated by a person, humane society, society for the
- 15 prevention of cruelty to animals, or any other nonprofit
- 16 organization for the care of homeless animals.
- 17 (h) "Cat" means a domestic cat of any age of the species Felis
- 18 catus. Felis catus.
- 19 (i) "Department" means the state department of agriculture and
- 20 rural development.
- 21 (j) "Director" means the director of the department or his or
- 22 her the director's authorized representative.
- (k) "Dog" means a domestic dog of any age of the species Canis
- 24 familiaris. Canis lupus familiaris.
- 25 (1) "Ferret" means an animal of any age of the species Mustela
- 26 furo.Mustela furo.
- 27 (m) "ICHAT" means the internet criminal history access tool
- 28 maintained by the department of state police.
- (n) "Intact dog" means a dog that has not been altered.

- 1 (o) "Large-scale dog breeding kennel" means a facility where
 2 more than 15 female intact dogs over the age of 4 months are housed
 3 or kept for the primary purpose of breeding. As used in this
 4 subdivision, "housed or kept for the primary purpose of breeding"
 5 means that the female dog has previously been bred and whelped. A
 6 female dog that has not previously produced offspring shall—is not
 7 be—considered to have been housed or kept for the primary purpose
- 9 (p) "Municipality" means a county, city, village, or township.
- 10 (q) "Person" means an individual, partnership, corporation,
 11 association, governmental entity, or other legal entity.
- 15 (i) The species, age, sex, breed, and description of an animal.
 16 ; any
- 17 (ii) Any medical conditions of the animal. ; any

- (iv) The fact that at the time of the preparation of the
 certificate the veterinarian examined the animal and found the
 animal free from visual evidence of communicable disease.
- 24 (s) "Pet shop" means a place where animals are sold or offered
 25 for sale, exchange, or transfer.brick-and-mortar commercial
 26 establishment that sells or offers for sale animals at retail, by
 27 appointment or otherwise, that are not bred at the establishment.
- 28 (t) "Rabbit" means a domestic rabbit of any age of the species 29 Oryctolagus cuniculus domesticus.

- 1 (u) (t) "Veterinarian" means a person an individual licensed
 2 to practice veterinary medicine under part 188 of the public health
 3 code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.18801 to 333.18838.
- Sec. 5a. (1) A person who operates Until July 1, 2025, a pet shop shall not import or cause to be imported into this state a dog or cat that is less than 8 weeks old. A person who operates an An animal control shelter or an animal protection shelter shall not import or cause to be imported into this state a dog or cat that is less than 8 weeks old unless the dog or cat is imported with its
- 10 dam. A large-scale dog breeding kennel shall not import or cause to
 11 be imported into this state a dog that is less than 8 weeks old
- 12 unless the dog is imported with its dam.
- 13 (2) A person who operates Until July 1, 2025, a pet shop shall
 14 not sell, exchange, transfer, or offer for sale, exchange, or
 15 transfer a dog or cat that is less than 8 weeks old. A large-scale
 16 dog breeding kennel shall not sell, exchange, or transfer a dog
 17 that is less than 8 weeks old.
- (3) Beginning July 1, 2025, a pet shop shall not sell, adopt, 18 19 exchange, or transfer, or offer for sale, adoption, exchange, or 20 transfer, a dog, cat, or rabbit. This subsection does not prohibit 21 a pet shop from collaborating with and offering space to an animal 22 control shelter or animal protection shelter to showcase adoptable 23 dogs, cats, or rabbits. The pet shop shall not retain an adoption 24 fee or any other fee for providing space to any dog, cat, or rabbit 25 showcased under this subsection.
- 26 (4) (3) A person that operates a pet shop, an An animal
 27 control shelter, an animal protection shelter, or a large-scale dog
 28 breeding kennel shall not, and until July 1, 2025, a pet shop shall
 29 not, import or cause to be imported into this state, or sell,

- 1 adopt, exchange, or transfer, or offer for sale, adoption,
- 2 exchange, or transfer a dog, unless all of the following are
- 3 satisfied before the dog's entry into this state:
- 4 (a) The dog has been vaccinated against distemper, parvovirus,
- 5 and canine adenovirus-2. The dog shall must also be vaccinated
- 6 against rabies and leptospirosis if the dog is 12 weeks of age or
- 7 older. If a rabies vaccine is required under this subdivision, the
- 8 vaccine shall must be administered by an accredited a veterinarian.
- 9 A person operating a pet shop or a large-scale dog breeding kennel
- 10 shall ensure that vaccinations other than the rabies vaccination
- 11 are administered not less than 7 days before the dog's entry into
- 12 this state. The director may require vaccinations against other
- 13 diseases not specified in this subdivision.
- 14 (b) If indicated, the dog has been treated for external and
- 15 internal parasites so that the dog is not capable of spreading
- 16 external or internal parasites to another animal at the time it is
- 17 imported into this state.
- 18 (c) The dog is accompanied by an interstate health certificate
- 19 or certificate of veterinary inspection signed by an accredited a
- 20 veterinarian licensed to practice veterinary medicine in the dog's
- 21 state of origin, including records of the dog's medication and
- 22 immunization.
- 23 (5) (4) A person who operates a pet shop, an An animal control
- 24 shelter , or an animal protection shelter shall not, and until July
- 25 1, 2025, a pet shop shall not, import or cause to be imported into
- 26 this state, or sell, adopt, exchange, or transfer, or offer for
- 27 sale, adoption, exchange, or transfer a cat, unless all of the
- 28 following are satisfied before the cat's entry into this state:
- 29 (a) The cat has been vaccinated against feline panleukopenia,

- 1 calici viruses, and feline herpes virus-1. The cat shall must also
- 2 be vaccinated against rabies if the cat is 12 weeks of age or
- 3 older. If a rabies vaccine is required under this subdivision, the
- 4 vaccine shall must be administered by an accredited a veterinarian.
- 5 A person operating a pet shop shall ensure that vaccinations other
- 6 than the rabies vaccination are administered to the cat as required
- 7 by this subdivision not less than 7 days before the cat's entry
- 8 into this state. The director may require vaccinations against
- 9 other diseases not specified in this subdivision.
- 10 (b) If indicated, the cat has been treated for external and
 11 internal parasites so that the cat is not capable of spreading
 12 external or internal parasites to another animal at the time it is
- 13 imported into this state.
- 14 (c) The cat is accompanied by an interstate health certificate
- 15 or certificate of veterinary inspection filled out and signed by $\frac{1}{2}$
- 16 accredited a veterinarian licensed to practice veterinary medicine
- 17 in the cat's state of origin, including records of the cat's
- 18 medication and immunization.
- 19 (6) (5) A person who operates a pet shop or a A large-scale
- 20 dog breeding kennel shall not sell, exchange, transfer, or deliver
- 21 a dog , cat, or ferret without providing to the purchaser a valid
- 22 pet health certificate. Until July 1, 2025, a pet shop shall not
- 23 sell, exchange, transfer, or deliver a dog or cat without providing
- 24 to the purchaser a valid pet health certification. A pet shop shall
- 25 not sell, exchange, transfer, or deliver a ferret without providing
- 26 to the purchaser a valid pet health certificate. For purposes of
- 27 this subsection, a pet health certificate is only valid for only 30
- 28 days after the date the animal was examined by the veterinarian who
- 29 signed the pet health certificate.

- Sec. 10. (1) Any Except as provided in subsection (2), a

 person who that violates the provisions of this act or any a rule

 the department of agriculture promulgated under the provisions

 this act is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- 5 (2) A person that violates section 5a(3) is subject to a civil 6 fine of not more than \$500.00 for each violation. Each dog, cat, or 7 rabbit sold, adopted, exchanged, or transferred, or offered for 8 sale, adoption, exchange, or transfer in violation of section 5a(3) 9 is considered a separate violation under this subsection. The 10 prosecutor of the county in which the violation occurred or the 11 attorney general may bring an action to collect the fine.
