by amending section 7 (MCL 42.7), as amended by 1992 PA 15.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 7. (1) The township board shall provide by resolution for
- 2 the time, date, and place of the board's regular meetings, and
- 3 shall hold at least 1 regular meeting each month. If a time set for
- 4 the holding of a regular meeting of the township board is a
- 5 holiday, then the regular meeting shall must be held at the same

- 1 time and place on the next day that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or
 2 holiday.
- $\bf 3$ (2) A special meeting of the township board $\bf shall$ $\bf must$ be
- 4 called by the township clerk pursuant to subsection (3) on the
- 5 written request of the supervisor or of 2 members of the township
- 6 board and on at least 24 hours' written notice to each member of
- 7 the township board. The notice shall must designate the time,
- 8 place, and purpose of the meeting and shall must be served
- 9 personally or left at the member's usual place of residence by the

(6) The township board shall determine its own rules and order 1 2 of business and shall keep a journal minutes of its proceedings in the English language. The journal shall minutes must be signed by 3 the supervisor and the township clerk. The vote upon the passage of 4 5 an ordinance τ and upon the adoption of a resolution and ordinance 6 shall must be taken by yes and no votes and shall must be entered 7 upon the record, except that if the vote is unanimous, it shall 8 must only be necessary to record that fact. Except as otherwise 9 provided in this subsection, a member of the township board who is 10 recorded as present shall vote on all questions decided by the 11 board unless excused by the unanimous consent of the other members present. the board member has a legal conflict. If a board member 12 has a legal conflict, the board member shall announce the member's 13 14 intent to abstain from voting and disclose on the official record 15 the factual basis for the abstention. If, at a meeting of the township board, a member of the township board states that he or 16 17 she the member desires to be appointed by the township board to 18 fill a vacancy in a township office, that member may abstain from 19 voting on the appointment to fill the vacancy. A board member must 20 be recognized immediately for the purpose of an abstention. As used 21 in this subsection, "legal conflict" means a situation in which the 22 private interest of a board member may influence the board member 23 in the performance of the board member's duties or responsibilities 24 under this act. A legal conflict includes, but is not limited to, 25 either of the following:

(a) An action that could have a substantial impact on the financial interests of the board member, the immediate family of the board member, or an organization with which the board member is associated.

(b) A question that involves the conduct of a board member, including, but not limited to, an allegation the board member violated a township ordinance, rule, or policy.

- (7) A writing prepared, owned, used, in the possession of, or retained by the board in the performance of an official function shall must be made available to the public in compliance with the freedom of information act, Act No. 442 of the Public Acts of 1976, being sections 15.231 to 15.246 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- 10 (8) The township board, by vote of not less than 2 members, 11 may compel the attendance of board members and other officers of 12 the township at a regular or special meeting and enforce orderly 13 conduct in the meeting. A member of the board or any other officer of the township who refuses to attend a meeting or conduct himself 15 or herself act in an orderly manner is quilty of misconduct in 16 office. The township marshal shall serve serves as the sergeant-at-17 arms of the township board in the enforcement of this section.
