A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

(MCL 333.1101 to 333.25211) by adding section 9129.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 9129. (1) Subject to appropriation, the department shall,
- 2 by rule, establish and implement a program to register a perinatal
- 3 facility as a level I, II, III, or IV maternal care facility. The
- 4 department shall establish the criteria for a perinatal facility to
- 5 attest to the facility's designation as a level I, II, III, or IV

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- 1 maternal care facility, with level I providing basic care to a
- 2 pregnant individual or fetus and level IV providing the most
- 3 advanced care to a pregnant individual or fetus with 1 or more of
- 4 the most complex maternal conditions. The criteria must require a
- 5 facility to use tools and self-assessments determined appropriate
- 6 by the department to attest to the facility's designation. The
- 7 criteria may include, but are not limited to, data collection and
- 8 reporting, patient volume, patient transportation, practice
- 9 guidelines, coordinating with and the referral of a patient to and
- 10 from another facility, implementing safety bundles, and inspections
- 11 of a perinatal facility.
- 12 (2) A perinatal facility seeking registration as a level I,
- 13 II, III, or IV maternal care facility under the program shall apply
- 14 to the department on a form and in a manner required by the
- 15 department. The department shall register a perinatal facility as a
- 16 level I, II, III, or IV maternal care facility if the perinatal
- 17 facility demonstrates to the satisfaction of the department that it
- 18 meets the applicable criteria for the facility level established
- 19 under the program. The department shall publish and annually update
- 20 on its website a list of each perinatal facility that is registered
- 21 as a level I, II, III, or IV maternal care facility.
- 22 (3) If the department determines that the perinatal facility
- 23 no longer meets the criteria established pursuant to rules
- 24 promulgated under this section for the registration as a level I,
- 25 II, III, or IV maternal care facility, as applicable, the
- 26 department may remove the facility from the list described in
- 27 subsection (2).
- 28 (4) This section does not require a perinatal facility to seek
- 29 a registration as a level I, II, III, or IV maternal care facility

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- 1 under the program to provide maternal care. However, a perinatal
- 2 facility that does not hold a registration as a level I, II, III,
- 3 or IV maternal care facility under the program shall not advertise
- 4 or otherwise hold itself out to the public as providing level I,
- 5 II, III, or IV maternal care or as holding a registration as a
- 6 level I, II, III, or IV maternal care facility.
- 7 (5) In promulgating rules for purposes of the program, the
- 8 department shall consult with recognized entities that are involved
- 9 in providing services in a perinatal facility, including, but not
- 10 limited to, the Michigan Perinatal Quality Collaborative, the
- 11 Michigan Health and Hospital Association, the American College of
- 12 Obstetricians and Gynecologists, and the American College of Nurse
- 13 Midwives. In establishing criteria for recognizing a perinatal
- 14 facility as a level I, II, III, or IV maternal care facility, the
- 15 department shall consider the maternal levels of care verification
- 16 program established by the Joint Commission and the maternal care
- 17 obstetric care consensus established by the American College of
- 18 Obstetricians and Gynecologists.
- 19 (6) As used in this section:
- 20 (a) "Perinatal facility" means a hospital licensed under
- 21 article 17 that provides maternal care.
- (b) "Program" means the program described in subsection (1).
