A bill to amend 2023 PA 281, entitled "Public officers financial disclosure act," by amending sections 3 and 7 (MCL 15.703 and 15.707).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Blind trust" means a qualified blind trust or qualified3 diversified trust as those terms are defined in 5 CFR 2634.403.
- 4 (b) "Department" means the department of state.
- 5 (c) "Earned income" means salaries, wages, tips, bonuses,

- 1 commissions, or other compensation or earnings from employment
- 2 earned during the reporting period.
- ${f 3}$ (d) "Form" means the financial disclosure form created by the
- 4 department in accordance with section 11.
- **5** (e) "Gift" means that term as defined in section 7 of the
- 6 Michigan campaign finance act, 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.207.
- 7 (f) "Honorarium" means that term as defined in section 7 of
- 8 the Michigan campaign finance act, 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.207.
- 9 (q) "Immediate family" means all of the following:
- 10 (i) A child residing in a public officer's household or an
- 11 individual claimed by that public officer or that public officer's
- 12 spouse as a dependent for federal income tax purposes.
- 13 (ii) A relative of the spouse of the public officer.
- 14 (iii) The spouse of a relative of the public officer.
- 15 (iv) A relative of the public officer that is within the
- 16 seventh degree of consanguinity as computed by the civil law
- 17 method.
- (h) (g) "Liabilities" means what a person owes to another
- 19 person, including, but not limited to, mortgages or other debts.
- 20 For purposes of this act, a debt does not include a revolving debt,
- 21 an unsecured debt that is from a financial institution or the
- 22 federal government, or a debt owed by a business entity.
- (i) (h)—"Lobbyist" means that term as defined in section 5 of
- 24 1978 PA 472, MCL 4.415.
- 25 (j) (i) "Lobbyist agent" means that term as defined in section
- 26 5 of 1978 PA 472, MCL 4.415.
- 27 (k) (j) "Spouse" means an individual who is lawfully married
- 28 to a public officer as described under 26 CFR 30.7701-18.
- 29 (l) (k)—"Public officer" means all of the following:

- 1 (i) A state representative.
- (ii) A state senator.
- 3 (iii) The attorney general.
- $\mathbf{4}$ (iv) The governor.
- 5 (v) The lieutenant governor.
- (vi) The secretary of state.
- 7 (m) (l)—"Report" means the financial disclosure report required 8 under section 10 of article IV of the state constitution of 1963.
- 9 (n) (m) "Reporting period" means the preceding calendar year.
- 10 (o) (n) "Unearned income" means income that is not earned from
- 11 employment, including, but not limited to, financial prize,
- 12 unemployment benefits, annuities, stock dividends, deferred
- 13 compensation, pension, profit sharing, or retirement income.
- 14 Unearned income does not include inheritance money or a familial
- **15** gift.
- Sec. 7. (1) A report required under section 5 must include a
- 17 complete statement of all of the following:
- 18 (a) The full name, mailing address, telephone number, and
- 19 email address of the public officer.
- 20 (b) The name and address of the public officer's employer and
- 21 the positions held during the reporting period, if the public
- officer receives \$1,000.00 or more in annual income from each
- 23 position.
- 24 (c) The name of the spouse of the public officer, the
- 25 occupation of the public officer's spouse, and the name of the
- 26 employer or employers of the public officer's spouse.
- 27 (d) Whether the public officer's spouse or immediate family
- 28 member was registered as a lobbyist or lobbyist agent under 1978 PA
- 29 472, MCL 4.411 to 4.431, during the reporting period.

- 1 (e) A list of all positions currently held as an officer,
- 2 director, trustee, partner, proprietor, representative, employee,
- 3 or consultant of any organization, corporation, firm, partnership,
- 4 or other business enterprise, nonprofit organization, labor
- 5 organization, or educational or other institution other than this
- 6 state. If this subdivision applies, the public officer shall
- 7 include the name of the organization. For purposes of this
- 8 subdivision, positions held in any religious, social, fraternal, or
- 9 political entity, or positions that are solely of an honorary
- 10 nature, are excluded.
- 11 (f) The source of earned income received during the reporting
- 12 period by the public officer. For purposes of this subdivision, the
- 13 public officer must shall report each source of income received
- 14 during the reporting period that is \$1,000.00 or more.
- 15 (g) Except as otherwise provided in this subdivision, a list
- 16 of each asset, excluding a business asset, held for investment or
- 17 production of income with a fair market value of \$1,000.00 or more
- 18 during the reporting period and any sources of unearned income that
- 19 exceed \$200.00 during the reporting period. The fair market value
- 20 for the purpose of listing each asset, excluding a business asset,
- 21 held for investment or production of income under this subdivision
- 22 must be adjusted for inflation every 4 years using the Detroit
- 23 Consumer Price Index, and rounded up to the nearest \$1,000.00.
- 24 (h) A list of all liabilities that exceed \$10,000.00 owed by
- 25 the public officer to a creditor at any time during the reporting
- 26 period.
- 27 (i) Except as otherwise provided in this subdivision, a list
- 28 of any stocks, bonds, or other forms of securities held by the
- 29 public officer or held jointly with the public officer's spouse or

- 1 immediate family member during the reporting period, if the
- 2 security has a total aggregate fair market value of \$1,000.00 or
- 3 more. The fair market value for the purpose of listing stocks,
- 4 bonds, or other forms of securities under this subdivision must be
- 5 adjusted for inflation every 4 years using the Detroit Consumer
- 6 Price Index, and rounded up to the nearest \$1,000.00. For purposes
- 7 of this act, a public officer is not required to disclose a stock
- 8 in a widely held investment fund, including, but not limited to, a
- 9 mutual fund, regulated investment company, pension or deferred
- 10 compensation plan, or other investment fund, if both of the
- 11 following apply:
- (i) Either the fund is publicly traded or the assets of the
- 13 fund are widely diversified.
- 14 (ii) The public officer or the public officer's spouse or
- 15 immediate family member does not exercise control over or have the
- 16 ability to exercise control over the financial interests held by
- 17 the fund.
- 18 (j) A list of any real property in which the public officer
- 19 holds an ownership or other financial interest. For purposes of
- 20 this subdivision, the public officer is required to include a real
- 21 property in the report only if that real property has a fair market
- value of \$1,000.00 or more during the reporting period. A public
- 23 officer filing a report may exclude the street number of a parcel
- 24 of real property under this subdivision.
- 25 (k) The date of, identity of parties to, and general terms of
- 26 any agreements or arrangements with respect to future employment, a
- 27 leave of absence while serving as a public officer, continuation or
- 28 deferral of payments by a former or current employer other than
- 29 this state, or continuing participation in an employee welfare or

- 1 benefit plan maintained by a former employer. As provided in
- 2 section 8, there is an ongoing duty to report any agreement or
- 3 arrangement entered into by a public officer after the filing
- 4 deadline described in section 5(2).
- $oldsymbol{5}$ (\$l\$) A list of all gifts received and reported by a lobbyist or
- 6 lobbyist agent under state law.
- 7 (m) A list of all travel payments received and reported by a
- 8 lobbyist or lobbyist agent under state law.
- 9 (n) A list of all travel payments received from a person that
- 10 is not a lobbyist, a lobbyist agent, a spouse, or an immediate
- 11 family member.
- 12 (o) A list of all tickets for concerts, sporting events, or
- 13 other entertainment received and reported by a lobbyist or lobbyist
- 14 agent under state law.
- 15 (p) A list of all tickets for concerts, sporting events, or
- 16 other entertainment received from a person that is not a lobbyist,
- 17 a lobbyist agent, a spouse, or an immediate family member.
- 18 (q) (n)—A list of each payment made by a lobbyist or lobbyist
- 19 agent to a charity in lieu of honoraria.
- (r) (o)—If applicable, a statement indicating that the public
- 21 officer or the public officer's spouse or immediate family member
- 22 is a registered vendor with this state, has a majority interest in
- 23 a company that is a registered vendor with this state, or is
- 24 employed by a company that is a registered vendor with this state.
- 25 If the public officer or the public officer's spouse or immediate
- 26 family member is a registered vendor with this state or has a
- 27 majority interest in a company that is a registered vendor with
- 28 this state, the public officer shall include the name of the
- 29 company and a description of all contracts entered into with this

- 1 state by the public officer, public officer's spouse or immediate
- 2 family member, or company in which the public officer or public
- 3 officer's spouse or immediate family member has a majority interest
- 4 during the reporting period. If the public officer or public
- 5 officer's spouse or immediate family member is employed by a
- 6 company that is a registered vendor with this state, the public
- 7 officer shall include the name of the company and a description of
- 8 all contracts entered into with this state that the public officer
- 9 or the public officer's spouse or immediate family member directly
- 10 worked on directly during the reporting period.
- 11 (2) A public officer is not required to disclose the value of 12 any real property or property disclosed under subsection (1).
- 13 (3) If a public officer required to file a report under this
- 14 section 5 holds a beneficial interest in a blind trust, the public
- 15 officer is not required to include the interests or assets of the
- 16 blind trust in the report. However, the public officer must shall
- 17 indicate in the public officer's report that the public officer
- 18 holds a beneficial interest in a blind trust. For purposes of As
- 19 used in this subsection, beneficial "beneficial interest" includes,
- 20 but is not limited to, the interest in a trust of a qualified trust
- 21 beneficiary or trust beneficiary as those terms are defined under
- 22 section 7103 of the estates and protected individuals code, 1998 PA
- 23 386, MCL 700.7103.
- 24 (4) A report required under section 5 must include the
- 25 following certification: "I certify that the statements I have made
- 26 on this financial disclosure form are true, complete, and correct
- 27 to the best of my knowledge and belief, and that I have not moved
- 28 assets during the reporting period for the purpose of avoiding
- 29 disclosure under the public officers financial disclosure act".
