## **HOUSE BILL NO. 5912**

August 15, 2024, Introduced by Reps. Hill and Hope and referred to the Committee on Criminal Justice.

A bill to amend 1982 PA 415, entitled "Correctional officers' training act of 1982," by amending sections 2, 9, 12, 13, 15, and 15a (MCL 791.502, 791.509, 791.512, 791.513, 791.515, and 791.515a), sections 2 and 15 as amended by 2003 PA 121, section 12 as amended and section 15a as added by 2012 PA 526, and section 13 as amended by 1989 PA 4; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Central training academy" means the a central training

- 1 academy established pursuant to under section 15.
- (b) "Correctional facility" means a facility or institution
   which that houses an inmate population under the jurisdiction of
- 4 the department. of corrections.
- 5 (c) "Council" means the correctional officers' training6 council created under section 3.
- 7 (d) "Department" means the state department of corrections.
- 8 (e) "Executive secretary" means the executive secretary of the
  9 council.
- 10 (f) "State correctional officer" means any person individual
  11 employed by the department in a correctional facility as a
  12 correctional officer or a corrections medical aide, or that
  13 person's individual's immediate supervisor.
- 14 Sec. 9. Beginning 6 months after the effective date of this 15 act, a person shall September 30, 1983, an individual must not be a 16 state correctional officer unless he or she the individual is 17 certified or recertified by the Michigan commission of corrections 18 as provided in section 10, 11, or department under section 12. The 19 Michigan commission of corrections department shall certify those 20 persons and recertify, on an annual basis, those persons an 21 individual who satisfy satisfies the criteria set forth in sections  $\frac{10 \text{ to}}{\text{under section}}$  12. 22
- Sec. 12. (1) Except as provided in subsections (2), (3), and

  (4), a person The department shall not certify or recertify an

  individual who is not employed as a state correctional officer on

  March 30, 1983 and who is not employed as a state correctional

  officer until after December 31, 1984, shall not be certified or

  recertified by the Michigan commission of corrections January 1,

  underscore the individual has done all of the following:

(a) Obtained a high school diploma or attained a passing score on the general education development test indicating a high school graduation level.

- (b) Successfully completed all of the following:
- 5 (i) One of the following:

- (A) A vocational certificate program as determined by the council, earned from an accredited postsecondary educational institution, which program shall require a minimum of 15 semester credit hours or 23 term credit hours.
  - (B) Equivalent course work to a vocational certificate program, as determined by the council, earned from an accredited postsecondary educational institution, which course work shall require a minimum of 15 semester credit hours or 23 term credit hours. The credit hours required under this subparagraph may have been earned at any time.
  - (C) A degree granted by an accredited postsecondary educational institution in a major discipline of study that is relevant to the position of state correctional officer, as determined by the council. A degree required under this subparagraph may have been earned at any time.
  - (i) (ii)—A minimum of 2 months of supervised —and paid internship,—job training within a correctional facility during which the individual learns and practices the skills of being a state correctional officer, as determined by the council. —as an intern in a correctional facility.
  - (ii) (iii)—A minimum of 320 hours of new employee training, as determined by the council, at the—a central training academy or at a college or community college as provided under section 15a.
    - (c) Fulfilled other minimum standards and requirements

developed under section 13 by the council and approved by the department for certification and subsequently for recertification.

- who was—is employed as a state correctional officer or an immediate supervisor of a correctional officer at the former Detroit house of correction on December 31, 1984 shall automatically be certified and annually recertified by the department until December 31, 1985. Beginning January 1, 1986, a person who was employed as a correctional officer or an immediate supervisor of a correctional officer at the former Detroit house of correction on December 31, 1984 shall not be recertified unless he or she has done both of the following:on January 1, 2025 unless the individual meets the minimum standards and requirements developed under section 13 by the council and approved by the department for recertification.
- (a) Completed successfully a minimum of 160 hours of training
  provided by the department.
  - (b) Fulfilled other minimum standards and requirements for recertification developed pursuant to section 13 by the council and approved by the department.
  - (3) A department of mental health direct care employee of a state facility officially designated for closure or phase-down due to deinstitutionalization, or a forensic security aide II or III employed by the department of mental health center for forensic psychiatry, or a work camp supervisor employed by the department of corrections shall automatically be certified and annually recertified by the department for 3 years following the date he or she became employed as a state correctional officer, if he or she has done all of the following:
- 29 (a) Within 1 year of the date he or she became employed as a

1 state correctional officer, obtained a high school diploma or
2 attained a passing score on the general education development test
3 indicating a high school graduation level.

(b) Within 1 year of the date he or she became employed as a state correctional officer, completed successfully 320 hours of new employee training with a credit up to 160 hours of previously acquired training, as approved by the council.

(c) Within 3 years of the date he or she became employed as a state correctional officer, completed 1 of the following:

(i) A vocational certificate program, as determined by the council, earned from an accredited postsecondary educational institution, which program shall require a minimum of 15 semester credit hours or 23 term credit hours.

(ii) Equivalent course work to a vocational certificate program, as determined by the council, carned from an accredited postsecondary educational institution. The course work shall require a minimum of 15 semester credit hours or 23 term credit hours. The credit hours required under this subparagraph may have been earned at any time.

(iii) A degree granted by an accredited postsecondary educational institution in a major discipline of study that is relevant to the position of state correctional officer, as determined by the council. A degree required under this subparagraph may have been earned at any time.

(d) Fulfilled other minimum standards and requirements developed under section 13 by the council and approved by the department for certification and subsequently for recertification.

(4) An employee of the department of community health who is employed as a forensic security aide at the Huron valley center of

the department of community health or the center for forensic 1 2 psychiatry of the department of community health, and who is transferred to a position as a state correctional officer employed 3 by the department of corrections, shall be automatically certified 4 and recertified by the department for 3 years after the date on 5 6 which he or she became employed as a state correctional officer, if 7 he or she meets all of the requirements established by law or by 8 the department for employment as a state correctional officer and 9 does all of the following: 10 (a) Before February 4, 2005, declares his or her intent to 11 accept the transfer to a position as a state correctional officer. 12 (b) Within 1 year of the date he or she became employed as a state correctional officer, obtained a high school diploma or 13 14 attained a passing score on the general education development test 15 indicating a high school graduation level. 16 (c) Within 3 years of the date he or she became employed as a 17 state correctional officer, completed 1 of the following: 18 (i) A vocational certificate program, as determined by the 19 council, earned from an accredited postsecondary educational 20 institution, which program shall require a minimum of 15 semester credit hours or 23 term credit hours. 21 22 (ii) Equivalent course work to a vocational certificate 23 program, as determined by the council, earned from an accredited 24 postsecondary educational institution, which course work shall 25 require a minimum of 15 semester credit hours or 23 term credit 26 hours. The credit hours required under this subparagraph may have 27 been earned at any time. 28 (iii) A degree granted by an accredited postsecondary

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educational institution in a major discipline of study that is

  2 determined by the council. A degree required under this
- 3 subparagraph may have been earned at any time.
- 4 (d) Within 1 year of the date he or she became employed as a
  5 state correctional officer, completed successfully 320 hours of new
  6 employee training with a credit up to 160 hours of previously
  7 acquired training, as approved by the council.
- 6 (e) Fulfilled other minimum standards and requirements, except
  9 for physical fitness requirements, developed under section 13 by
  10 the council and approved by the department for certification and
  11 subsequently for recertification.
  - (3) (5)—All minimum standards and requirements for certification and subsequently for recertification of persons individuals under subsections (1)  $\tau$ —and (2)  $\tau$ —and (4)—are subject to approval by the state civil service commission.
- Sec. 13. (1) Not later than June 30, 1983, and as often as necessary after that, the council shall develop minimum standards and requirements for state correctional officers with respect to all of the following:
- (a) Recruitment, selection, and certification of new state
  correctional officers based upon at least, but not limited to, work
  experience, educational achievement, and physical and mental
  fitness.
  - (b) New employee and continuing training programs.
- 25 (c) Recertification process.

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- (d) Course content of the vocational certificate program,
   required in section 12, the each central training academy, and
   continuing training programs.program.
  - (e) Decertification process.

- (2) Standards and requirements developed by the council under
   this section shall be are effective only if they are approved by
   the commission of corrections.department.
- 4 (3) Standards and requirements approved by the commission of

  5 corrections department under this section shall be are subject to

  6 approval by the state civil service commission.
- Sec. 15. The department shall establish a—1 or more central training academy academies for use as an—employee training center centers for state correctional officers. Funds necessary for the establishment and use of the—a central training academy shall must be provided by the department and supported by separate appropriation.
- 13 Sec. 15a. (1) Beginning April 1, 2013, and as often as 14 necessary after that, the council shall develop minimum standards 15 and requirements for a certification program for new employee training under section  $\frac{12(1)}{(b)}(iii)$  12(1) to be offered by community 16 17 colleges and colleges. Only the council or a community college or 18 college that is approved by the council may provide training or a 19 certificate of completion for new employee training as described in section  $\frac{12(1)}{(b)}\frac{(iii)}{(iii)}$  12(1) and this section. The council shall 20 21 designate the form for a certificate of completion for individuals 22 completing new employee training at community colleges or colleges under this section. 23
- (2) The council may provide for the decertification of
  programs that fail to meet the standards developed by the council
  under subsection (1).
- Enacting section 1. Sections 10 and 11 of the correctional officers' training act of 1982, 1982 PA 415, MCL 791.510 and 791.511, are repealed.
