THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 16801. (1) As used in this part:
- 2 (a) "Audiologist" means an individual who is licensed under
- 3 this article to engage in the practice of audiology.
- 4 (b) "Practice of audiology" means the nonmedical and

- 2 (i) Facilitating the conservation of auditory system function.

- 6 (iv) Selecting, fitting, prescribing, and dispensing of
 7 amplification systems, including hearing aids and related devices,
 8 and providing training for their use.
- 9 (ν) Providing auditory training, consulting, education, and 10 speech reading to individuals with hearing disorders.
- (vi) Administering and interpreting tests of vestibular
 function and tinnitus in compliance with section 16809 and in
 adherence to the mandate of subsection (2).
- 14 (vii) Routine cerumen removal from the cartilaginous portion of 15 the external ear in otherwise healthy ears except that if the 16 audiologist, while engaged in routine cerumen removal, discovers 17 any trauma, including, but not limited to, continuous uncontrolled 18 bleeding, lacerations, or other traumatic injuries, he or she the 19 audiologist shall, as soon as practically possible, refer the 20 patient to a person an individual who is licensed to engage in the practice of medicine or osteopathic medicine and surgery. 21
