## **HOUSE BILL NO. 6168**

November 26, 2024, Introduced by Reps. Xiong, Rheingans, Glanville, Scott, Wegela, Brixie, Hill, McKinney, Dievendorf, Morgan, Brenda Carter, Young and Brabec and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 1979 PA 94, entitled "The state school aid act of 1979,"

by amending sections 11 and 99g (MCL 388.1611 and 388.1699g), section 11 as amended by 2024 PA 148 and section 99g as amended by 2024 PA 120.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 11. (1) For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025,
- 2 there is appropriated for the public schools of this state and
- 3 certain other state purposes relating to education the sum of
- 4 \$17,769,551,300.00 \$17,778,551,300.00 from the state school aid

- 1 fund, the sum of \$78,830,600.00 from the general fund, an amount
- 2 not to exceed \$41,000,000.00 from the community district education
- 3 trust fund created under section 12 of the Michigan trust fund act,
- 4 2000 PA 489, MCL 12.262, an amount not to exceed \$125,000,000.00
- 5 from the school transportation fund created under section 22k, an
- 6 amount not to exceed \$71,000,000.00 from the enrollment
- 7 stabilization fund created under section 29, an amount not to
- 8 exceed \$30,000,000.00 from the school meals reserve fund created

2 (2) The department shall award funding under this section to
3 districts in urban, suburban, and rural areas in this state and
4 shall award funding as follows:

(a) To at least 3 districts that are located in Wayne County that must include Detroit Public School Community District, 1 suburban district, and 1 rural district.

(b) To at least 1 district located in Eaton County.

- 9 (c) To at least 1 district located in Grand Traverse County.
- 10 (d) To at least 1 district located in Kent County.
- (e) To at least 1 district located in Macomb County.

(3) A district that receives funding under this section shall use the funding to provide, upon request from eligible students, feminine hygiene products at no cost to eligible students enrolled in the district. From the funding allocated under this section, each eligible student must receive, at a minimum, 20 tampons or menstrual pads each month for the school year.

- (2) To receive funding under this section, a district must apply for the funding in a form and manner prescribed by the department.
- (3) A district that includes menstrual hygiene products in at least both of the following in each school building operated by the district is an eliqible district under this section:
  - (a) 1 bathroom designated for use by females.
- 29 (b) 1 bathroom designated for use by males or both males and

- 2 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, from the
- 3 funding under this section, each eligible district must receive a
- 4 reimbursement of the percentage of costs associated with the
- 5 inclusion of menstrual hygiene products in its school buildings as
- 6 described in subsection (3) that is equal to the percentage of
- 7 pupils enrolled in the eligible district who are eligible for free
- 8 or reduced-price meals as determined under the Richard B. Russell
- 9 national school lunch act, 42 USC 1751 to 1769j. However, each
- 10 eligible district must receive a reimbursement under this section
- 11 for at least 50% of the costs described in this subsection.
- 12 (5) Upon request by a district, and after the submission by
- 13 the district of its estimated costs associated with the inclusion
- 14 of menstrual hygiene products in its school buildings as described
- 15 in subsection (3), in a form and manner prescribed by the
- 16 department, the department shall provide the requesting district
- 17 the estimated reimbursement the district would receive under this
- 18 section.
- 19 (6)  $\frac{(4)}{(4)}$  As used in this section,  $\div$
- 20 (a) "At-risk pupil" means that term as defined in section 31a.
- 21 (b) "Eliqible student" means a student who is an at-risk
- 22 pupil. "menstrual hygiene products" includes, but is not limited to,
- 23 tampons and menstrual pads.
