## **SENATE BILL NO. 560**

October 04, 2023, Introduced by Senator CAVANAGH and referred to the Committee on Economic and Community Development.

A bill to amend 1921 PA 2, entitled

"An act to promote the efficiency of the government of the state, to create a state administrative board, to define the powers and duties thereof, to provide for the transfer to said board of powers and duties now vested by law in other boards, commissions, departments and officers of the state, and for the abolishing of certain of the boards, commissions, departments and offices, whose powers and duties are hereby transferred,"

by amending section 3 (MCL 17.3), as amended by 2021 PA 143.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 3. (1) The state administrative board shall exercise

- (5) Subject to subsection (6), the state administrative board may inter-transfer funds—intertransfer money within the appropriation for a particular department, board, commission, officer, or institution. If the inter-transfer—intertransfer of funds could otherwise be accomplished through the transfer process under section 393 of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393, the state administrative board may carry out the inter-transfer—intertransfer only if both of the following requirements have been met:
