A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

(MCL 380.1 to 380.1852) by adding section 1161.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1161. (1) Beginning with the 2025-2026 school year, each
- 2 public school in this state shall establish and maintain a school
- 3 library that meets at least all of the following:
- 4 (a) Is housed in a central location outside of a physical
- 5 classroom, provides an environment for expanded learning, and

- 1 supports a variety of student interests.
- 2 (b) Provides an organized and cataloged collection and
- 3 services that adequately support student independent reading and
- 4 learning for enrichment and the curriculum offered by the school.
- 5 The building-level school administrators shall ensure that pupils
- 6 and teachers have efficient and equitable access to these
- 7 resources, including, but not limited to, making collection
- 8 resources available in both print and electronic form.
- 9 (c) Has an intellectual and academic freedom statement and a
- 10 collection development policy that follows best practices and
- 11 includes, but is not limited to, procedures for materials
- 12 selection, deselection, and reconsideration.
- 13 (d) Serves as a community resource by providing parents and
- 14 legal guardians of the school's pupils and community members access
- 15 to the school library's resources, as determined appropriate by the
- 16 school.
- 17 (2) Beginning with the 2025-2026 school year, each public
- 18 school in this state shall ensure that each school library operated
- 19 by the public school participates in an interlibrary loan system.
- 20 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 21 after the date it is enacted into law.

- 23 unless all of the following bills of the 102nd Legislature are
