March 13, 2024, Introduced by Senator IRWIN and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Affairs.

A bill to amend 1998 PA 58, entitled "Michigan liquor control code of 1998,"

by amending section 513 (MCL 436.1513), as amended by 2022 PA 216.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:
