## **SENATE BILL NO. 799**

March 14, 2024, Introduced by Senator KLINEFELT and referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.

A bill to amend 2008 PA 23, entitled

"Enhanced driver license and enhanced official state personal identification card act,"

by amending section 4 (MCL 28.304), as amended by 2021 PA 72.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 4. (1) The secretary of state may issue an enhanced
- 2 driver license or enhanced official state personal identification
- 3 card to an applicant who provides satisfactory proof of his or her
- 4 the applicant's full legal name, United States citizenship,
- 5 identity, date of birth, Social Security number, residence address,

- 1 and a photographic identity document. Beginning June 27, 2021, if
- 2 the applicant is a program participant in the address
- 3 confidentiality program under the address confidentiality program
- 4 act, 2020 PA 301, MCL 780.851 to 780.873, he or she the applicant
- 5 shall present to the secretary of state his or her the applicant's
- 6 participation card issued under the address confidentiality program
- 7 act, 2020 PA 301, MCL 780.851 to 780.873. An applicant may choose
- 8 to apply for a standard driver license or standard official state
- 9 personal identification card or an enhanced driver license or
- 10 enhanced official state personal identification card.
- 11 (2) An enhanced driver license or enhanced official state
- 12 personal identification card must include reasonable security
- 13 measures to protect against unauthorized disclosure of personal
- 14 information regarding residents of this state that is contained in
- 15 the enhanced driver license or enhanced official state personal
- 16 identification card.
- 17 (3) An enhanced driver license or enhanced official state
- 18 personal identification card may include radio frequency
- 19 identification technology that is limited to a randomly assigned
- 20 number that must be encrypted if agreed to by the United States
- 21 Department of Homeland Security, and does not include biometric
- 22 data. The secretary of state shall ensure that the radio frequency
- 23 identification technology is secure from unauthorized data access
- 24 and includes reasonable security measures to protect against
- 25 unauthorized disclosure of personal information. An applicant must
- 26 sign a declaration acknowledging his or her the applicant's
- 27 understanding of the radio frequency identification technology
- 28 before he or she the applicant is issued an enhanced driver license
- 29 or enhanced official state personal identification card.

- 1 (4) An enhanced driver license or enhanced official state
- 2 personal identification card that expires on or after March 1, 2020
- 3 is considered valid until March 31, 2021. An enhanced driver
- 4 license or enhanced official state personal identification card
- 5 that expires after March 31, 2021 but before August 1, 2021 is
- 6 valid until 120 days after the date of the expiration.
- 7 (5) The requirements of this act are in addition to the
- 8 requirements otherwise imposed on individuals who apply for a
- 9 standard driver license or standard official state personal
- 10 identification card.
- 11 (6) The holder of an enhanced driver license issued under this
- 12 act is subject to every licensing sanction provided under the
- 13 Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923. As used
- 14 in this subsection, "licensing sanction" means the restriction,
- 15 suspension, revocation, or denial of a driver license; the addition
- 16 of points to a driving record; until October 1, 2018, the
- 17 assessment of a driver responsibility fee; the assessment of a
- 18 civil fine or criminal penalty resulting from a conviction; a civil
- 19 infraction determination; the imposition of probationary terms and
- 20 conditions; or any other penalty provided under the Michigan
- 21 vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923.
- 22 (7) Beginning June 27, 2021, upon receipt of a notice from the
- 23 department of the attorney general that an individual who has been
- 24 issued an enhanced driver license or enhanced official state
- 25 personal identification card under this act has been certified as a
- 26 program participant in the address confidentiality program, the
- 27 secretary of state shall issue a corrected enhanced driver license
- 28 or enhanced official state personal identification card to that
- 29 individual by mailing the license or card to his or her the

- 1 individual's designated address. Beginning June 27, 2021, an
- 2 enhanced driver license or enhanced official state personal
- 3 identification card issued under this subsection or subsection (1)
- 4 to a program participant must display the individual's designated
- 5 address and must not display the individual's residence address.
- 6 The requirements of this subsection are in addition to the
- 7 requirements for individuals who are issued a corrected standard
- 8 driver license under section 310f of the Michigan vehicle code,
- 9 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.310f, or a corrected official state personal
- 10 identification card under section 2a of 1972 PA 222, MCL 28.292a.
- 11 (8) As used in this section:

- 21 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 22 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 23 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 24 unless Senate Bill No. 706 of the 102nd Legislature is enacted into
- **25** law.
